Matthew Glup, a 1987 graduate of Plattsmouth High School, currently serves the City of Omaha as a firefighter. Matt has been a first responder for sixteen years. He followed in his father, Carl's footsteps, a retired, twenty-nine year veteran of the Omaha Fire Department. Matt currently holds the title of Fire Apparatus Engineer. He drives and operates the fire truck and is an EMT. Matt, along with all other firefighters, work under the guidelines of LIP, Life Safety of others as well as themselves, Incident Stabilization (putting out the fire or accomplishing the rescue), and Property Conservation (removal of burnt debris and protection of property).

Matt spent his childhood in Plattsmouth. He is the son of Carl⁶⁶ and Linda Bowman Glup⁶⁶, he has a brother Aaron⁹¹ and sister Niki Glup Campin⁹⁵. Matt entered Army Basic Training in 1989. His unit, the 172nd Transportation Company out of Omaha was called up to active duty in September of 1990. Matt served as a Diesel Mechanic and Equipment Operator. He spent nine months in Saudi Arabia serving in Operation Desert Shield/Storm. Matt's uncle, Lanny Glup^{'77} served in the same unit.

Matt makes his home in Plattsmouth with his wife Megan and their four children: Danielle, Jack, Joe, and Emma. Matt uses his experiences acquired from his years as a firefighter to give back to his hometown community. Matt will begin his 8th year on the Plattsmouth School Board in January. Matt also volunteers at local schools in the district to teach area students about fire safety. Matt exclaimed, "Serving the public and helping people in need are two factors that have inspired me to be a dedicated husband, father, and citizen of my hometown."

Defender of Freedom inducted into PHS Hall of Fame

In September of 2011 Ronald A. Hicks Jr., class of 1989, was inducted into the Plattsmouth Hall of Fame. Our August Alumni Newsletter article about Ronald had quite an impressive, lengthy list of his military accomplishments and awards during his 18 years of active duty in the United States Army. Ronald is now stationed at Fort Hood in Texas. His military occupational specialty is 19D or Calvary Scout on an M3A3 Bradley Fighting Vehicle. His positions have included: Scout crew member, driver, gunner, vehicle commander, section leader and platoon sergeant. He is currently responsible for human resources for more than 900 personnel. We would like to introduce you to the man behind those medals and ribbons.

Ronald's parents, Ronald and Helene Hicks are both from New Hampshire. Ronald Sr. was in the U.S. Air Force during the Vietnam War. As a military dependent Ronald and his family traveled and resided in numerous places that include, Florida, New Hampshire, Indiana, Philippines, California, and finally Nebraska. The assignment at Offutt AFB brought the Hicks family to Plattsmouth in 1984. Ronald's two younger brothers are also PHS graduates, Thomas ^{'94} of Plattsmouth and Bryon ^{'96} of Papillion. While in high school Ronald participated in football and basketball until he decided maintaining his car by way of a part-time job made it difficult to continue in athletics. He worked at the Plattsmouth Manor in the Dietary Department for almost four years. Ronald started his military career early by doing Basic Training during the summer between his junior and senior years of high school and went into the U.S. Army in 1993. Ronald has been stationed and deployed to many different locations over the years including, Texas, Korea, Kentucky, Georgia, Florida, Bosnia, Kuwait, and Iraq.

Ronald and his wife Pamela Petersen of Georgetown, Kentucky reside in Killeen, Texas with his daughter Cassondra and stepson Tyler Benard. Besides keeping up with family activities, Ronald enjoys video gaming (1st person shooters and sports games) and target practice with his personal weapons. He intends to retire from the Army in December of 2012 in Texas and possibly relocate back to Kentucky when job opportunities arise.

It was evident that the Hicks family is very supportive of their military hero at the induction events in September. Ronald and wife Pam, along with children Cassie and Tyler made the trip from Texas. Ronald's parents Ronald Sr. and Helene came from Kentucky. Plattsmouth Community Schools Happenings... "Destination ImagiNation"

It is widely recognized that creativity, innovation, and the ability to manage change are essential competencies for today's students who live in, and are preparing to enter the workplace in, a world of rapid and accelerating change. A survey of more than 400 employers found their biggest concerns were that youth lacked 21st-century skills that will make them competitive in the job market. Three-fourths of those employers viewed creativity and innovation to be among the top-five skills most important in the current climate (eSchool News, October 2006).

Since 1989, Plattsmouth students have had the opportunity to hone their 21st-century skills by participating in Odyssey of the Mind and, in later years, Destination ImagiNation (DI). Both programs still exist today. However, after litigation in 1999, Destination ImagiNation was formed as a non-profit organization.

Destination ImagiNation is an educational program in which student teams solve open-ended Challenges and present their solutions at Tournaments. Teams are tested to think on their feet, work together and devise original solutions that satisfy the requirements of the Challenges. The Challenges change each year and they range from highly technical to highly theatrical. This allows students with different talents to take advantage of the program. Participants gain more than just basic knowledge and skills—they learn to unleash their imaginations and take unique approaches to problem solving.

As each school year rolls around, all Plattsmouth middle and high school students are invited to form a team of up to 7 members and take on one of the new DI Challenges. This year's challenges range from creating a movie trailer to building a structure that weighs less than 50 grams but is able to hold up to 1200 pounds. The team members are expected to show responsibility by keeping their grades up, completing homework assignments on time, and by being excellent role models for their peers.

Through the years, Plattsmouth students have developed a strong tradition of excelling in the Destination ImagiNation program. The students have made it to the state finals every year since 1990. Those teams that win at the state level earn the opportunity to compete at Global Finals. At Global Finals, teams from around the world come together in Knoxville, Tennessee to perform their Challenge solutions.

In 1993, Plattsmouth sent its first state champion to the Odyssey of the Mind World Finals in Ames, Iowa. Since 1999, Plattsmouth has been successful in sending one or more teams to the Global Finals every year. The teams have also consistently

They were fairies in their skit that had the following requirements: Design and build a Structure made only of Aluminum Foil, Wood and Glue, Test how much weight the Structure will hold, Present a Story about a character that is Foiled and Integrate team-written Verse and published Verse into your Story placed in the top 10 at these global competitions. In 2006 and 2007, one of our high school teams had back-to-back 3^{rd} place finishes at Globals.

Throughout the school year, the teams must also work on raising funds to cover expenses for the state and global competitions. (The Global Finals trip costs approximately \$1000 per team member.) The teams have worked concessions, sold candy bars and coupon books, held dances, and waited tables at the alumni luncheon to help offset their costs. Many of you have probably purchased some of these items or made donations to the program and for that the DI teams thank you!

The Destination ImagiNation regional competition will be held at Plattsmouth High School on March 31, 2011. So, mark your calendar and stop by to check out how the teams from eastern Nebraska solve this year's challenges. If you would like to know more about the program, or if you are interested in being a judge for one of the challenges, contact Wanda Wiemer at Plattsmouth Community Middle School.
