Call to order

Chairman Michael Purcaro called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM.

Chairman's Report

The chairman stated its annual report season, he encourages all residents to read the town's report. Mr. Purcaro stated he's very happy with the work we are doing to close out the budget year. He stated he has asked Matt Reed to present during the meeting to introduce himself to the board.

Presentations

a. Matt Reed – Town Administrator

Mr. Reed stated he's looking forward to meeting all department heads, boards, and commissions. He's excited to learn more about the short and long-term goals the town has. Mr. Reed stated the community he came from didn't have a Board of Finance, so he's excited to see how the board and the finance department work together. Mrs. Busse asked if he plans on holding a town hall

explaining what his role is and how it came about. Mr. Reed stated he is going to attend as many town events as he can.

Financial Report

Mrs. Pignataro presented a highlighted summary of the preliminary monthly budget report for the fiscal period ended July 31, 2023. As of July 31, 2023, 49.9% of property tax revenue has been collected. She stated there was a pole that was struck by lightning, totaling \$170,471 for town road aid. Mrs. Pignataro stated Youth Services came in strong receiving 42.0% YTD budget revenue. Mr. Purcaro stated we need to keep an eye on insurance.

New Business

This is a proposal to transfer funds from underfunded accounts to offset accounts that were over budget.

Route 83 Easement - FY2023-24 Appropriation Request
