Academic Schedule

HHCA operates on a hybrid block schedule of 45-, 60-, and 90-minute classes. Most 90-minute classes run semester-long; most 45- and 60-minute classes run year-long.

Course Offerings

All academic core courses (English, history/social studies, mathematics, and science) are offered at College Preparatory (CP) and Honors (H) levels, with the exceptions of Algebra 3 (CP only), Precalculus (H only), and Spanish 1 & 2 (CP only).

AP courses are capped at a maximum of four and run year-long. This year, 97 students are taking 182 AP courses. AP offerings include*:

*AP Research will be added in 2024-25, along with the AP Capstone Diploma. APs not offered this year: AP European History, AP Statistics, AP Spanish Language and Culture, and AP Spanish Literature and Culture.

Dual Enrollment

Juniors and seniors with a 3.0 unweighted GPA may pursue dual enrollment opportunities with the University of South Carolina-Beaufort, Technical College of the Lowcountry, and online university programs. There are 78 iuniors and seniors enrolling in 130 dual-credit courses this year.

Diploma with Distinction

This graduation honor is bestowed upon students who complete an independent research project culminating in a written and verbal defense of their thesis.

Elective Courses

Students may choose from a variety of fine arts, technology, physical education, and interest-based electives, including: Art, Ceramics, Theater Production, Theater Design, Chorus, Band, Yearbook, Graphic Design, PLTW Computer Science, Strength & Fitness, Sports Medicine. PLTW Biomedical Science. Personal Finance, Senior and Junior Seminars, Teacher Aide, and Internships.

Academic Resource Center

HHCA's NILD-certified staff provides academic support for students with documented learning challenges, aiming to produce confident, passionate and purposeful achievers prepared for college, career, and life.

<u>Internships</u>

Fifty-three HHCA juniors and seniors are currently interning in the community, gaining experience in their field of interest. HHCA students have completed internships in dance, law, medicine, marketing, real estate, physical therapy, marine biology, interior design, engineering, architecture and more.

Athletics

HHCA offers 30 athletic teams, including 17 varsity sports, with over 80% of high school students participating. More than 60 state championship titles have been earned throughout school history. Each year, a number of HHCA athletes go on to play collegiate sports (4 in 2023; 5 in 2022).

Since 2015, HHCA has earned 14 SCISA State Championship titles: Girls Basketball (5), Boys Golf (3), Boys Soccer (2), Football (2), and Girls Soccer (2).

In 2022-23, state championships were earned in Girls Basketball (5th in a row), and Boys Golf.

Fine Arts

Over 70% of students participate in HHCA's award-winning Fine Arts programs, which include theater, music, and visual arts.

HHCA theater students have been recognized by Broadway World SC for recent stage productions and performances. This year, student actors will present Aristocats KIDS (K-5th), Little Women (9th-12th), and The Music Man (6th-12th). HHCA draws students from around the country to its annual summer Jazz Camps. Band students may perform in jazz combos and ensembles, pit orchestra, and other unique musical offerings during the year. Budding artists often exhibit their work in our local arts community.
