Is my phone number safe?

STOPit operates an anonymous platform and no PII (personally identifiable information) is required for registration and use, and the applications are not built to accept PII. All incident data that is reported on the platform is stored on their secure hosting infrastructure. Their platform and personnel, and the infrastructure on which it resides is SOC2 certified and has carried this status since 2019. SOC2 is a third-party independent audit of data-related internal controls and security and it prevent the misuse or mis-handling of sensitive personal data, and from selling data to any third-party - or anyone. The incident data itself also may be used by the crisis center team in response to an emergency. The purpose of their crisis center is only to monitor for emergencies that are reported through the platform and engage law enforcement or other emergency resources to aid an emergency, as directed by schools. There is no other purpose and incident data or details are not used in any other manner.

Is STOPit promoting a political agenda?

From STOPit: “We have none and do not speak of or broadcast a position on political topics during the course of our work. Our written personnel policies, which are acknowledged by our employees during the course of their employment with us, specifically prevent this. Our purpose and mission is solely to help schools keep their students safe, and we serve schools in all 50 states and in areas that some believe to be heavily politically oriented (both to the right and left).”

Who are STOPit’s customers?

They serve more than 200,000 students in Indiana. This number expands to more than 4,000,000 in all 50 states. Texas and California are their 2 largest states.
