


A Message from Superintendent Ciancio

Dear Mapleton families,

As we close out this unusual school year, I want to thank you for your compassion, your support, and your partnership over the last few months. This school year was filled with everything from ribbon cuttings to remote learning, and the Mapleton community has embraced every milestone and unexpected turn with courage, with curiosity, and with confidence.

I know you have a lot of questions about our plan to welcome your family back to school in the fall. We continue to work closely with Tri-County Health Department, as well as other state health leaders to monitor the COVID-19 situation in our community. Our reopening plan is being informed by the latest guidance on precautions so we may continue to prioritize the health and wellbeing of our students, our families, and our staff. We are also asking parents/guardians to complete a brief, anonymous survey to understand the needs, interests, and concerns of our families as we move toward reopening.

It is our intent to reopen our schools in August. With that said, we know that they will look and operate a little differently than they have in previous years. On-site modifications will be made at each school to promote social distancing, limit group gatherings, and provide for plenty of handwashing and school sanitation opportunities. We will also introduce a blended learning approach for students at each school. This will allow for seamless transitions between in-person and intermittent remote learning, should a temporary closure be deemed necessary.

Based on feedback from our families, we will be offering an additional school choice for the 2020-2021 school year: <u>"Mapleton Online"</u>. This new school will allow students to stay virtually connected while continuing to learn from home. If you wish to choose this new option, please complete your registration as-soon-as reasonably possible. Information can be found on <u>our website</u>.

Regardless of where your child chooses to learn this coming school year, our dedication to strong relationships, rigorous academics, and engaging learning opportunities will continue to be the 'Mapleton way.'

New August Start Date

To ensure that our teachers have the right amount of time to prep our schools for your child's return, we are moving our first day of school to **Thursday, Aug. 27. We will open our doors for all students, grades PreK-12, on Thursday, Aug. 27, and Friday, Aug. 28.**

As a part of our cautious and progressive start to the upcoming school year, students will not have school on Monday, Aug. 31, or Tuesday, Sept. 1. These two days will allow schools to apply what they learned in the first two days back to school and make the necessary modifications and adjustments. **All students will return to school on Wednesday, Sept. 2, and the regularly scheduled student calendar will resume.**Updated calendars are now available on <u>our website</u>.

I hope you have a safe and restful summer. To continue our commitment to your child's academic success, we are pleased to share that all students are invited to keep their iPad or Chromebook, checked out, over the summer. Technology assistance available over the summer

To assist your summer learning needs, our Help Desk will continue to be available to assist with your technology needs. If your child is experiencing any of the following issues with his/her device, or if you are leaving the school district and need to return your device, please email the IT Help Desk at <u>helpdesk@mapleton.us</u> or call the Help Desk at 303.853.1057.

- Physical repairs/damage keys falling off, battery won't charge, the screen is cracked, etc.
- Technical issues/concerns won't turn on, needs to refresh or reboot, etc.
- Difficulties using/navigating the device password needs reset, log in is incorrect, needs specific apps, etc.

Please include the following information:

- Student's first and last name
- Student's school and grade
- Your contact information home phone, cell phone, and email
- Please tell us if the device is a Chromebook or iPad
- The Asset tag number from the back or bottom of the device (looks like a barcode, begins with the letter A)
- A description of the problem

Your Help Desk request will be assigned to an IT technician who will contact you immediately to address the issue or schedule an appointment to swap out your device.



'Grab & Go' meals available in Mapleton through June 30

To continue with our commitment to providing well-balanced meals to students, Mapleton will continue to offer walk-up or drive-through 'Grab & Go' meals at three sites in Mapleton every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, through June 30.

'Grab & Go' meals include lunch for the day and breakfast for the next day. Every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, Nutrition Services will provide families with multiple days' worth of meals. For example, on Monday, families can pick up meals for both Monday and Tuesday. These meals are available to all children through age 18, regardless of what school they attend. No paperwork, proof of residence, or student identification is required. This program is for pick-up of meals only. Meals cannot be consumed on-site.

It's Annual Update time!

What is the Annual Update?

Formerly known as registration, the Annual Update is the online process that allows Mapleton families to verify and submit the required information and confirm each child's placement for fall. Families can complete the Annual Update from anywhere with an internet connection.

Annual Update

How do I complete the Annual Update?

Visit the <u>Infinite Campus Parent Portal</u> and login to your Infinite Campus Parent Portal account on a computer or smartphone. Once you are logged in click on **"More"** and then select **"Annual Update"**.

What if I forgot my Parent Portal Account information?

You can request an email with your account information by clicking **"forgot username"** or **"forgot password"**. Contact the main office of the school your child attends if you have questions or any problems accessing your account.

What information do I need to confirm during the Annual Update?

As a parent/guardian of a currently enrolled Mapleton student, the Annual Update process will ask you to confirm or update the following information:

- Address (Please select 'change of address' and contact your school to update your address)
- Phone numbers (home phone, cell phone, work phone)
- Email address
- Emergency contacts
- Information about your child's health conditions and/or medications
- Confirm school for the 2020-21 school year
- School Behavior Handbook
- Additional school or district policies and release

If you would like to make changes to additional information not available through the Annual Update process, please contact your child's school.

When do I need to complete the Annual Update process?

Please complete the Annual Update process as soon as possible so we can confirm your child's spot at his/her school. Completing the Annual Update is the best way to let your child's school know to save your spot as you will be returning for the 2020-21 school year.
