Governor Polis announced the suspension of in-person learning in public and private schools across the state through Friday, April 17. We look forward to welcoming students back on Monday, April 20.

There will be no school for students through Friday, April 17. This applies to all Mapleton schools, including preschool, toddler care, and the employee childcare program. During this time, all student events and after school activities are postponed. We are working closely with our state and local public health partners as we monitor the <u>Coronavirus (COVID-19)</u>.

Preparing for home-based learning

Mapleton's remote learning plan is based on three simple ideas: supporting continuous standards-based instruction, removing barriers and ensuring access for all students, and maintaining and strengthening connectedness within the Mapleton community.

As we embrace the new adventure ahead, we want to remind our families that online learning is new to all of us. For the next few weeks, our learning will look, feel and sound different. What remains unchanged is our caring community and our dedication to the success of each student. All schools will continue to support instruction through a variety of digital and non-digital materials and instructional activities. All materials and activities will be standards-based to help keep students on track. We are also committed to providing a device to all students in grades K-12. We are close to meeting that goal.

Internet resources:

Xfinity has announced an <u>Xfinity WiFi Free For Everyone</u> program. Through it, Xfinity hotspots across the country will be available to anyone who needs them for free. <u>Search</u> for a hotspot near you.

Comcast Internet Essentials is offering two free months of their Internet Essentials package starting March 16, 2020. You have to be eligible, so <u>read more on their website</u>. You can also call 1-855-846-8376.

AT&T is opening up its public WiFi hotspots for anyone to use for free.

<u>Sprint</u> is providing unlimited data for 60 days to customers with metered data plans and giving 20 GB of free mobile hotspot to customers with hotspot-capable devices.

<u>T-Mobile</u> is allowing all customers on limited data T-Mobile and Metro by T-Mobile plan unlimited data for the next 60 days; adding 10 GB of mobile hotspot each month for the next two months for T-Mobile postpaid and Metro customers on smartphone plans, and giving Lifeline partners extra free LTE data each month.

'Grab & Go' meals available in Mapleton

Mapleton recognizes that when children are well-nourished, their ability to learn improves. To continue with our commitment to providing delicious and well-balanced meals to students, we are offering walk up or drive through 'Grab & Go' meals at five sites in Mapleton to ensure no one learns on an empty stomach. All families will receive lunch for the day and breakfast for the next day. These meals will be available to all children through age 18, regardless of what school they attend. No paperwork, proof of residence, or student identification is required. This program is for pick-up of meals only. Meals cannot be consumed on-site.

Meals may be picked up from the following locations, Monday - Friday, **between 11:00 a.m. -12:30 p.m., through Friday, April 17.**

Global Primary Academy (7480 N. Broadway, Denver) - Pick up will be in the bus loop by GPA.

Clayton Partnership School (Skyview Campus, 8980 York St., Thornton) - Pick up will be in the Clayton loop

Meadow Community School (9150 Monroe St, Thornton) - Pick up will be on the west side of the building. **Welby Community School** (1200 E. 78th Ave., Denver) - Pick up will be in the bus loop beginning on the north side of the building.

York International School (9200 York St., Thornton) - Pick up will be in the bus loop

On Fridays, families are encouraged to take home meals for Saturday and Sunday, too!

Gov. Polis has issued a state-wide 'stay-at-home' order to stop the spread of COVID-19, however, our lunch sites remain open. Families are encouraged to practice safe social distancing procedures when visiting our sites.

How to talk to your child about COVID-19

Stay calm, listen and offer reassurance

- Children will react to and follow your reactions. You are their role model. They learn from your example.
- Your discussion about COVID-19 can increase or decrease your child's fear. Deep breathing is a valuable tool for calming the nervous system. Demonstrate such strategies. Do breathing exercises with your children.
- If true, remind your child that your family is healthy, and you are going to do everything within your power to keep loved ones safe and well.
- Tell your child that your family is following the guidelines of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, CDC, which includes social distancing. Social distancing means staying away from others until the risk of contracting COVID-19 is under control. While we don't know how long it will take to "flatten the curve," Reduce the number of those infected, we do know that this is a critical time. We must follow the guidelines of health experts to do our part.

 Make it as fun as possible. Do family projects. Organize belongings, create masterpieces, Sing, laugh, and go outside if possible to connect with nature and get needed exercise.

Parents/guardians should monitor television viewing and social media

- During a crisis, it is wise to limit television viewing of sites that increase fear. Parents should also monitor the internet and social media sites that their child/children are using as well as their own.
- Explain to your child that many stories about COVID-19 on the Internet may include rumors and inaccurate information.
- Talk to your child about factual information about this disease.
- Watching continual updates on COVID-19 may increase anxiety.
- Developmentally inappropriate information, information designed for adults, can cause anxiety or confusion, particularly in young.
- Engage your child in games or other exciting activities instead.

Be honest and accurate.

 Look for the most up to date information regarding Novel Coronavirus from reliable sources, such as the <u>Center for Disease Control</u>, <u>Colorado Department of Public</u> <u>Health and Environment</u>.

Model basic hygiene and healthy lifestyle practices

- Encourage your child to practice daily good hygiene—simple steps to prevent spreading the virus.
 - Wash your hands multiple times a day for 20 seconds.
 - Compliment your child when he/she uses a Kleenex or sneezes or coughs into the bend of their elbow. Teach them the importance of throwing away used

tissues immediately after sneezing or coughing.

 Sadly, handshakes and hugs need to be limited to immediate family members, at least for now.

It's Annual Update time!

What is the Annual Update?

Formerly known as registration, the Annual Update is the online process that allows Mapleton families to verify and submit the required information and confirm each child's placement for fall. Families can complete the Annual Update from anywhere with an internet connection.

How do I complete the Annual Update?



Visit the <u>Infinite Campus Parent Portal</u> and login to your Infinite Campus Parent Portal account on a computer or smartphone. Once you are logged in click on **"More"** and then select **"Annual Update"**.

What if I forgot my Parent Portal Account information?

You can request an email with your account information by clicking **"forgot username"** or **"forgot password"**. Contact the main office of the school your child attends if you have questions or any problems accessing your account.

What information do I need to confirm during the Annual Update?

As a parent/guardian of a currently enrolled Mapleton student, the Annual Update process will ask you to confirm or update the following information:

- Address (Please select 'change of address' and contact your school to update your address)
- Phone numbers (home phone, cell phone, work phone)
- Email address
- Emergency contacts
- Information about your child's health conditions and/or medications
- Confirm school for the 2020-21 school year
- School Behavior Handbook
- Additional school or district policies and release

If you would like to make changes to additional information not available through the Annual Update process, please contact your child's school.

When do I need to complete the Annual Update process?

Please complete the Annual Update process as soon as possible so we can confirm your child's spot at his/her school. Completing the Annual Update is the best way to let your child's school know to save your spot as you will be returning for the 2020-21 school year.

Who do I contact for help?

Hand washing - an easy and effective way

to stay healthy

Proper handwashing is one of the easiest and most effective ways to stop the spread of disease. Teaching children good handwashing habits early in life can help them lead a healthier life. Washing your hands will help keep you, your family and your children healthy.

Proper handwashing steps:

- 1. Use soap and warm running water
- 2. Scrub hands for at least 20 seconds and use a nail brush
- 3. Wash all surfaces, including: between fingers under fingernails back of hands wrists
- 4. Rinse well
- 5. Dry hands with a clean paper towel
- 6. Turn off the water using the paper towel, and then throw the towel away

DriveSafe online driving school

Mapleton Public Schools is partnering with DriveSafe Driving Schools to offer students an interactive, online driver's education program. The DriveSafe state-certified online program costs \$74. The course is 100 percent online, no textbooks or software needed. It is self-paced, offers easy to follow lessons and is fully interactive with animations, games, and videos. The goal of the course is to increase a new driver's confidence and knowledge in a variety of driving situations. The program is designed to be equivalent to an in-person classroom experience but can be completed from anywhere with an internet connection. DriveSafe focuses on defensive and safe driving habits to help make new drivers become a
