2021-22 academic calendar

Thank you to the more than 600 students, staff, and parents who contributed to the creation of the 2021-22 academic calendar. The calendar was adopted by the Board of Education during their regular business meeting in February.

The approved 2021-22 calendar includes:


- A full week off in November for Thanksgiving
- Two full weeks off for winter break
- Spring break starting the third week of March (similar to other districts in the metro area)
- Student and staff school year end date prior to Memorial Day in May

It's Annual Update time!

What is the Annual Update?

Formerly known as registration, the Annual Update is the online process that allows Mapleton families to verify and submit the required information and confirm each child's placement for fall. Families can complete the Annual Update from anywhere with an internet connection.



How do I complete the Annual Update?

Visit the <u>Infinite Campus Parent Portal</u> and login to your Infinite Campus Parent Portal account on a computer or smartphone. Once you are logged in click on **"More"** and then select **"Annual Update"**.

What if I forgot my Parent Portal Account information?

You can request an email with your account information by clicking **"forgot username"** or **"forgot password"**. Contact the main office of the school your child attends if you have questions or any problems accessing your account.

What information do I need to confirm during the Annual Update?

As a parent/guardian of a currently enrolled Mapleton student, the Annual Update process will ask you to confirm or update the following information:

- Address (Please select 'change of address' and contact your school to update your address)
- Phone numbers (home phone, cell phone, work phone)
- Email address
- Emergency contacts
- Information about your child's health conditions and/or medications
- Confirm school for the 2020-21 school year
- School Behavior Handbook
- Additional school or district policies and release

If you would like to make changes to additional information not available through the Annual Update process, please contact your child's school.

When do I need to complete the Annual Update process?

Please complete the Annual Update process by the end of March, so we can confirm your child's spot at his/her school. Completing the Annual Update is the best way to let your child's school know to save your spot as you will be returning for the 2020-21 school year.

Who do I contact for help?

If you need help along the way, please contact the main office of your child's school.

Free tax assistance

This tax season, Mapleton is partnering with the Denver-based Piton Foundation to provide free tax preparation services to families through Tax Help Colorado. IRS-certified Mapleton juniors and seniors from Global Leadership Academy and Academy High School will help prepare and file tax returns free of charge for household incomes that were less than \$56,000 in 2019.

The free tax assistance will be offered at Global Leadership Academy/Global Intermediate Academy (7480 N. Broadway, Denver, 80221), every Tuesday until Tuesday, March 17.

Students have been trained to ensure that the individuals that they serve get the best refund possible by helping them claim tax credits meant to help working families. This tax service is free and confidential.



Hand washing - an easy and effective way to stay healthy

Proper hand washing is one of the easiest and most effective ways to stop the spread of disease. Teaching children good hand washing habits early in life can help them lead a healthier life. Washing your hands will help keep you, your family and your children healthy.

Proper hand washing steps:

- 1. Use soap and warm running water
- 2. Scrub hands for at least 20 seconds and use a nail brush
- 3. Wash all surfaces, including: between fingers under fingernails back of hands wrists
- 4. Rinse well
- 5. Dry hands with a clean paper towel
- 6. Turn off the water using the paper towel, and then throw the towel away

Paw Pass replacement payments can now be made online

Families now have the option to pay for Paw Pass replacements online using <u>MySchoolBucks</u>. Paw Pass replacements are \$3.00. Families may use their existing <u>MySchoolBucks</u> account to order a replacement



Paw Pass, or create an account. The Paw Pass helps Mapleton's Transportation Department offer an additional layer of safety and security for all students who ride a Mapleton bus from home to school and from school to home. As a reminder, any Mapleton student who rides the bus from home to school and from school to home needs a Paw Pass.

STEP is accepting new volunteers!

The Mapleton Public Schools Senior Tax Exchange Program (STEP) provides opportunities for Mapleton's senior citizens to reduce their property taxes by volunteering at one of Mapleton's many district-wide events or individual schools.

STEP is for senior citizens 60 years of age or older who own a home within the Mapleton boundaries. As a STEP volunteer, senior citizens may earn up to \$154.50 (a rate of \$5.15 per hour for a maximum of 30 hours) to apply toward property taxes. Shortly after the first of the year, the Adams County Treasurer will automatically deduct the amount earned as a STEP volunteer.

To apply, visit Mapleton's Administration Building, 7350 N. Broadway, Denver, 80221, to fill out an application. Please bring your photo ID so we may conduct a background check. Call 303.853.1018 for more information.

DriveSafe online driving school

Mapleton Public Schools is partnering with DriveSafe Driving Schools to offer students an interactive, online driver's education program. The DriveSafe state-certified online program

costs \$74. The course is 100 percent online, no textbooks or software needed. It is self-paced, offers easy to follow lessons and is fully interactive with animations, games, and videos. The goal of the course is to increase a new driver's confidence and knowledge in a variety of driving situations. The program is designed to be equivalent to an in-person classroom experience but can be completed from anywhere with an internet connection. DriveSafe focuses on defensive and safe driving habits to help make new drivers become a safe driver for life. To enroll in the online program,
