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Construction Update

Crews at Explore PreK-8 are putting the finishing touches on the nature-based playground equipment, including the swing set and zipline! On the west side of the building, the

preschool playground has a tractor-themed jungle gym setup, perfect for Explore's youngest learners. In the grand hall, the fireplace stonework is done and crews are painting the drywall in the cafeteria, offices, and library. In the east wing of classrooms, the floors are polished and covered. Casework, light fixtures, backpack hooks, and paint remain ongoing throughout the school.

Global Intermediate Academy's library is now fully enclosed by the Kalwall translucent wall panels. The library will allow natural daylight to flow through the area with glare-free usable light during school hours and a unique glowing effect at night. For the next few weeks, crews will focus on the exterior primer, stonework, and installation of the last precast windows. Drywall has started enclosing the first-floor classrooms and hallways, and will soon move upstairs.

Data-driven instruction in Mapleton

MEC students embrace data to inform community-building events

Mapleton schools are using data-driven instruction to improve knowledge, understanding, and skills for all students. Teachers at all Mapleton schools meet regularly and review classroom data to uncover gaps in student understanding and find opportunities for more relevant instruction.

It comes as no surprise that Mapleton students are also turning to data to improve their school communities.

Four pizzas, eight students, and an endless supply of positivity and bright ideas described a typical meeting of Mapleton Early College High School's Student Community Group. The group meets every Monday during lunch to, "discuss community issues within the school and brainstorm positive and inclusive ideas."

Wanting to plan events and activities aimed at building even better relationships at MEC, but not knowing exactly where to begin, the group decided to start with data and

composed a student survey.

"To help MEC we had to understand MEC," said Karly, a junior.

The survey asked students to weigh in on MEC's sense of community, academic rigor, internship program, and support for student learning. At first, the Student Community Group wasn't sure what to expect.

"I thought data can sometimes be unreliable, because people might not always take surveys seriously, but doing this survey completely changed my attitude," said Shane, a senior. "People were honest and gave feedback that will improve our school community."

The group got some good news – very good news – about their school community. Students said they feel like they belong as a member of the MEC community, that their internships provide them with meaningful learning experiences, and that they are proud of the projects they presented at their Exhibition.

The group also got some great ideas of areas they can work to make positive improvements. Planning is underway for some exciting community-building initiatives.

Free tax assistance

This tax season, Mapleton is partnering with the Denver-based Piton Foundation to provide free tax preparation services to families through Tax Help Colorado. IRS-certified Mapleton

juniors and seniors from Global Leadership Academy and Academy High School will help prepare and file tax returns free of charge for household incomes that were less than \$56,000 in 2019.

The free tax assistance will be offered at Global Leadership Academy/Global Intermediate Academy (7480 N. Broadway, Denver, 80221), every Tuesday from 4 – 7:30 p.m., beginning Tuesday, Feb. 4 through Tuesday, March 17.

Students have been trained to ensure that the individuals that they serve get the best refund possible by helping them claim tax credits meant to help working families. This tax service is free and confidential.

Paw Pass replacement payments can now be made online

Families now have the option to pay for Paw Pass replacements online using MySchoolBucks. Paw Pass replacements are \$3.00. Families may use their existing MySchoolBucks account to order a replacement Paw Pass, or create an account. The Paw Pass helps Mapleton's Transportation Department offer an additional layer of safety and security for all students who ride a Mapleton bus from home to school and from school to home. As a reminder, any Mapleton student who rides the bus from home to school and from school to home needs a Paw Pass.

Families with students rolling up into the next grade level at their current school will be asked to complete the online Annual Update (formerly known as registration) in April.

New to Mapleton students and current Mapleton families needing to select a new school for the 2020-21 school year:

- February: Enrollment and School Placements
 - School placement letters emailed to families.

- March 2 Enrollment for out of district families begins.
- February August:
 - Ongoing enrollment and school placement (school placement is processed as applications are received)
 - **Waitlist:** Parents may add their child to the waitlist if their first-choice school is full. The waitlist resets at the end of each month.

Preschool Enrollment Timeline:

• January 2020

- Preschool applications for enrollment are accepted apply online!
- Evaluations for eligibility-based assistance will be scheduled in May 2020

March 2020

 Apply for preschool by March 31 to be included in the first round of screenings and lottery placements

• June 2020

Eligibility-based assistance appointments and school placements

• June - September 2020

- Ongoing eligibility-based assistance appointments and placement
- Out-of-district placements made if space is available

STEP is accepting new volunteers!

The Mapleton Public Schools Senior Tax Exchange Program (STEP) provides opportunities for Mapleton's senior citizens to reduce their property taxes by volunteering at one of Mapleton's many district-wide events or individual schools.

STEP is for senior citizens 60 years of age or older who own a home within the Mapleton boundaries. As a STEP volunteer, senior citizens may earn up to \$154.50 (a rate of \$5.15 per hour for a maximum of 30 hours) to apply toward property taxes. Shortly after the first

of the year, the Adams County Treasurer will automatically deduct the amount earned as a STEP volunteer.

DriveSafe online driving school

Mapleton Public Schools is partnering with DriveSafe Driving Schools to offer students an interactive, online driver's education program. The DriveSafe state-certified online program costs \$74. The course is 100 percent online, no textbooks or software needed. It is self-paced, offers easy to follow lessons and is fully interactive with animations, games, and videos. The goal of the course is to increase a new driver's confidence and knowledge in a variety of driving situations. The program is designed to be equivalent to an in-person classroom experience but can be completed from anywhere with an internet connection. DriveSafe focuses on defensive and safe driving habits to help make new drivers become a safe driver for life. To enroll in the online program,


