### **Capital Construction Updates**

### **Mapleton Arts Center - The MAC**

In Mapleton, we believe that all students deserve the opportunity to perform on Broadway! The district's Performing Arts program continues to grow in both opportunities and student participation. Nearly 900 students throughout the district play in the band, orchestra, choir or marching band, or perform in the color guard or theater program. Unable to accommodate all students in the current Performing Arts space on the Skyview Campus, teachers and students can be found rehearsing early in the morning and throughout the school day in hallways or tucked into corners of the busy Skyview Student Center.

The Mapleton Arts Center, or the MAC, is the last building to be constructed on the Broadway Campus, and will help support the district's booming Performing Arts program and create exciting community partnership opportunities. The MAC will feature an auditorium with seating for 900 people, indoor and outdoor performance areas, classroom space, and much more. The MAC will also have a black box theater, which is a simple performance space that allows for flexible and creative stage use and audience interaction.

Neenan is in the final design phase of the MAC and expects to break ground on the building before the new year. The MAC will be located north of Global Primary Academy, in the northwest corner of the Broadway Campus. The MAC is expected to open in 2021, and will be available for use by all students from all Mapleton schools.

Construction on the new Explore PreK-8 is on time, and crews are beginning to work on landscaping around the building. Explore's current sixth graders, who will be the first group of seventh graders in the new building, had an opportunity to tour their new school and are excited to move in this August. A live camera feed of the progress is available here.

Global Intermediate Academy is also on track to open in August 2020. Construction of the stairway is complete, windows have been installed in classrooms, and crews will soon begin construction of the library, made from Kalwall. The material will allow for unique illumination throughout the building.

### **Data-driven instruction in Mapleton**

In the book, "Driven by Data," Paul Bambrick-Santoyo introduces the idea of data-driven instruction as a philosophy for schools that focuses on two simple questions.

- 1. How do we know if our students are learning?
- 2. And if they are not, what do we do about it?

Bambrick-Santoyo continues to share, that "by making these two questions the center of their work, successful schools made a fundamental break from traditional education. What

matters is not whether the teacher taught it, but whether the students learned it."

At Monterey Community School, a school that became a Performance school this year, data-driven instruction has been the focus of School Director Brett Drobney since he joined Mapleton last year. Teachers participate in weekly, data-driven meetings to identify gaps and misconceptions in each student's understanding of recent lesson plans. From there, teachers use the data to inform the "why" they want students to be able to articulate after each lesson plan, and revisit or restructure lessons accordingly.


Academic improvement at Monterey is also informed by the use of Istation. Istation is a computer-based reading assessment that helps teachers and parents identify a student's strengths as well as areas of growth.

As one of Colorado's most prestigious and recognized performance groups, qualifying for All State Choir is no easy task. The audition process is competitive and requires incredible skill and



preparedness on part of the student. York International senior, Jeremy N. was up to the task!

Auditions are scored on a point system by qualified judges from the Colorado region. Once selected, students are given six songs specific to their choir for the All State Choir Concert. Students must rehearse and memorize their part before their second audition. Accepted students are placed in one of three choirs - the Mixed Choir, the Tenor/Bass Choir, and the

Treble Choir. Jeremy will be performing in the Tenor/ Bass Choir.

The Colorado All State Choir program runs from Thursday, Feb. 20, through Saturday, Feb. 22, at the Denver Center for the Performing Arts (DCPA). # Kelly Grenham is named the Colorado Association of School Nurses Nurse of the Year!

Congratulations to Mapleton's own Kelly Grenham on receiving the Colorado Association of School Nurses Nurse of the Year award!

This award recognizes the importance and work of school nurses by honoring a school nurse who has demonstrated excellence in school nursing practice and leadership in school health. Nominees for



this award are evaluated on their contributions in three categories, including providing excellent school health care to students, developing professional relationships within schools, and advocating for student health through legislation efforts.

In Colorado, there are more than 500 school nurses, and we are thrilled to share that this is the second time Kelly has been recognized as the CASN Nurse of the Year. Her first nomination was in 2011.

"I am a little overwhelmed by it all, to be honest," Kelly said. "At the ceremony, there were six superstar nurses nominated, and to be standing next to them was pretty amazing."

Working in a smaller district, Kelly said she appreciates the meaningful relationships she is able to build with families by working with them year after year. "I came home when I

came into school health," Kelly said. "What other jobs are there where you get to support people in such a meaningful way? Our job is about helping students do and feel their best every day, so they can be their very best in and outside of school."

Kelly was nominated by Kathleen Keelan, Mapleton's Director of Integrated Services. In her nomination essay, Kathleen wrote, "Kelly is a lead nurse here and embodies what an exceptional school nurse does in every way...I truly think she should be the CASN School Nurse of the Year. Kelly reminds me every day of what Florence Nightingale meant when she said, 'Let us never consider ourselves finished nurses...we must be learning all of our lives.'"

### **Train safety**

RTD wants you and your children to be safe around trains. RTD is currently running test runs of the N Line, the 13-mile commuter rail that will provide service from Union Station through Denver, Commerce City, Northglenn and eventually north Adams County. With two of the seven stations located in/near Mapleton, 88th Avenue and 104th Avenue, RTD is partnering with Mapleton to raise awareness about safety on and near trains.

Please note that RTD has installed a temporary barrier to prohibit public access to the pedestrian underpass at Original Thornton - 88<sup>th</sup> Avenue Station. RTD is encouraging parents to remind children that is both dangerous



and illegal to trespass at the stations along the future N Line or enter the commuter rail guideway during construction. The overhead electric wires are dangerous and full of

electricity. Do not try to touch them or reach them with an object.

### **Important winter weather reminders**

Cold weather can sometimes cause Mapleton Public Schools to delay school start times or close schools for the safety of students and staff. We will try to give families plenty of notice before a weather-related school delay or closure. Mapleton will be using a two-hour delayed start on those days when storms hit overnight but may be gone by mid-day.

On a delayed start day, the school will begin two hours later than the usual start time. For example, if school normally begins at 8:10 a.m., a two-hour delay would mean it begins at 10:10 a.m. Bus pick-up times would also be delayed by two hours.

If your child is normally at the bus stop by 7:30 a.m., on a late start day they would need to be at the bus stop by 9:30 a.m.

A two-hour delay would also mean that Zero Hour classes will be canceled for that day as well as morning (AM) preschool. Full-day preschool will begin two hours late and afternoon (PM) will start on time.

Families will be notified of either a late start or cancellation through Infinite Campus with either a call, text or email. If you don't have an Infinite Campus Parent Portal account, please contact your child's school to create one or update your contact information. Local television and radio stations will have weather-related delays and closure information as well as Mapleton's Facebook and Twitter pages and website, <a href="https://www.mapleton.us">www.mapleton.us</a>.
