Data-driven instruction in Mapleton

Mapleton strives to ensure every student in every classroom receives the support and opportunities needed to be successful. To that end, this year Mapleton teachers are heavily focused on data-driven instruction and will be using data analysis to improve knowledge, understanding, and skills for all students. Throughout the school year, teachers will review data and additional information to uncover gaps in student understanding and find opportunities for more relevant instruction.

Prioritizing the 2020 Standards

The Colorado Academic Standards form the foundation of Colorado's public education system by defining what every graduate of a public school in Colorado should know, understand and be able to do. SB 08-212 has a provision that requires the regular review and revision of Colorado Academic Standards every six years. The most recent revision is set to be implemented beginning in 2020.

The 2020 Colorado Academic Standards are on display at the Administration Building. Families are invited to review the materials and leave comments and questions. <u>The standards may also be viewed online.</u>

Accreditation Report

The Colorado Department of Education bases a district's accreditation on three criteria: student achievement (based on CMAS), student growth (CMAS and ACCESS) and post-secondary and workforce readiness measures, which include graduation rate, dropout rate, matriculation rate and SAT scores.

This year, Mapleton was assigned the accreditation rating of "Accredited with Improvement Plan." Mapleton has earned this rating for the past six years. It is considered healthy, however, a rating of "Accredited" is an attainable goal for the near future.

Individual schools are eligible for one of four plan type categories based on the percentage of points earned on the School Performance Frameworks. The four accreditation categories, from highest to lowest, are Performance Plan, Improvement Plan, Priority Improvement and Turnaround.

Mapleton is pleased to celebrate **eight schools in the Performance category** and **eight schools in the Improvement category**. Mapleton has two schools in Priority Improvement and no schools in Turnaround.

Olweus Bullying Prevention


Mapleton is in the beginning stages of implementing the Olweus Bullying Prevention Program in all schools. The Olweus Bullying Prevention Program (OBPP) is the most researched and best-known bullying prevention program available today and has been proven to prevent or reduce bullying throughout a school setting. This grant-funded program will be taught to all school leaders this school year and introduced to students next school year.

The goals of the program are:

- To reduce existing bullying problems among students.
- To prevent the development of new bullying problems.
- To achieve better peer relations at school.

OBPP is a whole-school, systems-change program that includes school-wide, classroom, individual and community program components.



Important winter weather reminders

Cold weather can sometimes cause Mapleton Public Schools to delay school start times or close schools for the safety of students and staff. We will try to give families plenty of notice before a weather-related school delay or closure. Mapleton will be using a two-hour delayed start on those days when storms hit overnight but may be gone by mid-day.

On a delayed start day, the school will begin two hours later than the usual start time. For example, if school normally begins at 8:10 a.m., a two-hour delay would mean it begins at 10:10 a.m. Bus pick-up times would also be delayed by two hours. If your child is normally at the bus stop by 7:30 a.m., on a late start day they would need to be at the bus stop by 9:30 a.m.

A two-hour delay would also mean that Zero Hour classes will be canceled for that day as well as morning (AM) preschool. Full-day preschool will begin two hours late and afternoon (PM) will start on time.

Families will be notified of either a late start or cancellation through Infinite Campus with either a call, text or email. If you don't have an Infinite Campus Parent Portal account, please contact your child's school to create one or update your contact information. Local television and radio stations will have weather-related delays and closure information as well as Mapleton's Facebook and Twitter pages and website, www.mapleton.us.

You can text 'CO' to '2VOTE' (28683) on your smartphone to update or complete your voter registration information.




DriveSafe online driving school

interactive, online driver's education program. The DriveSafe state-certified online program costs \$74. The course is 100 percent online, no textbooks or software needed. It is self-paced, offers easy to follow lessons and is fully interactive with animations, games, and videos. The goal of the course is to increase a new driver's confidence and knowledge in a variety of driving situations. The program is designed to be equivalent to an in-person classroom experience but can be completed from anywhere with an internet connection.
