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Welcome to Trailside Academy!

Trailside Academy, the newest addition to Mapleton's menu of schools that are small-by-design, opened to students on Monday, Aug. 19. This PreK-8 school is located at 2300 W. 68th Ave., in the new Midtown neighborhood. This school building was designed to be the

bridge between older brick homes to the north and newer developments to the south. Inspired by urban art, the school's innovative layout makes the most of the five-acre plot and is already receiving rave reviews from students and staff. The construction of Trailside Academy was made possible by the community-supported 2016 bond.

We're moving into phase three of our capital construction plan, which includes upgrades and renovations to Monterey Community School and Achieve Academy, as well as the construction of the Performing Arts Center on Broadway and the transformation of the current Explore school building into a district preschool center. Adventures in Mapleton begins with 6MAX

Adventures in Mapleton (AIM) is a new initiative that enriches student learning by providing unparalleled, experiential, authentic learning outside of a traditional classroom setting.

As a part of this program, this year all sixth graders in Mapleton will have the chance to 'elevate' their learning by attending camps at either Cal-Wood Education Center or Keystone Science Center. Sixth graders will spend two nights and three days learning about STEM and environmental science up in the beautiful Colorado mountains. Trips will begin in September, with two schools attending camp each month through April.

Engaging experiences provided through AIM foster the growth and development of a child's public spirit and sense of social responsibility. AIM reinforces Mapleton's commitment to nurturing the whole child and the idea that all growth requires risk. Information about additional AIM programs will be shared throughout the school year.

September is Attendance Awareness Month

According to Attendanceworks.org, students who missed fewer than two school days in

September typically have good attendance rates for the entire year. On the other hand, poor attendance in the first month of school is often a predictor of chronic absenteeism, defined as two or more absences per month, for the entire school year.

A good school year starts with good attendance! Mapleton continues to prioritize consistent attendance for every student in an effort to raise student achievement. At their August business meeting, Mapleton's Board of Education adopted a proclamation recognizing September as Attendance Awareness Month. Important winter weather reminders

Winter weather is just around the corner. Cold weather can sometimes cause Mapleton Public Schools to delay school start times or close schools for the safety of students and staff. We will try to give families plenty of notice before a weather-related school delay or closure. Mapleton will be using a two-hour delayed start on those days when storms hit overnight but may be gone by mid-day.

On a delayed start day, the school will begin two hours later than the usual start time. For example, if school normally begins at 8:10 a.m., a two-hour delay would mean it begins at 10:10 a.m. Bus pick-up times would also be delayed by two hours. If your child is normally at the bus stop by 7:30 a.m., on a late start day they would need to be at the bus stop by 9:30 a.m.

A two-hour delay would also mean that Zero Hour classes will be canceled for that day as well as morning (AM) preschool. Full-day preschool will begin two hours late and afternoon (PM) will start on time.

Families will be notified of either a late start or cancellation through Infinite Campus with either a call, text or email. If you don't have an Infinite Campus Parent Portal account, please contact your child's school to create one or update your contact information. Local television and radio stations will have weather-related delays and closure information as well as Mapleton's Facebook and Twitter pages and website, www.mapleton.us.

That is why every school day, Mapleton strives to meet the nutritional needs of students by providing healthy, from-scratch meals and fresh fruits and vegetables at all schools.

As part of this commitment, Mapleton Public Schools is pleased to provide breakfast to all students at no cost.

To receive lunch at no cost, students must qualify for reduced-price meals through the National School Lunch Program. [Fill out your free and reduced form online today!](#) It's secure, it's easy, and it will help us provide your child(ren) with nutritious, made-from-scratch meals all year long. Families must keep their annual Federal Meal Benefit application current. Only one form per family is needed, which must be filled out every year. The application is secure and confidential. **The information provided by families on the free and reduced-price application will be used only for determining eligibility for meal or milk benefits and verification of eligibility.**

We also have a convenient online service site, free to our Mapleton families, that allows you to securely pay for your child's meals online using your credit/debit card or electronic

check.

The online service site allows you to:

- Set up automatic recurring payments
- Track and review meal history
- Create low balance alerts
- Make payments with the mobile app
