- For the 2023-2024 academic year, 556 students are enrolled in the upper school and 135 in the Class of 2024.
- Both AP courses and the IB diploma are available to students. It is rare for students to take AP courses on top of pursuing the IB diploma.
- Approximately 20 students enroll in the full IB program each year.
- Several courses are considered AP/IB equivalents or beyond. These are marked with an asterisk on our course listing.
- · Students are not ranked, but a GPA distribution is provided.
- Students are expected to report any disciplinary infractions that result <u>in an out of school suspension.</u>
- A summer Science Outreach Program gives motivated students opportunities to serve as researchers at college labs and a new state-ofthe-art math and science building delivers innovative, hands-on curriculum and lab work for all students.
- A deep and varied international travel program offers students the chance to participate in global service, academic, and cultural immersion experiences on five continents.
- Weddington Farm, located 10 miles from the CCDS campus, offers a 360 acre dynamic resource for students and teachers to get hands-on experience in sustainable agriculture, exploration and co-curricular programing.

The IB Diploma Program

Country Day was the first independent school in North Carolina to offer the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program. Country Day has approximately 20 students enroll in the full IB program each year. Over the last five years, our IB students have had an average diploma pass rate of 98%, which is well above both the US and International pass rates.

The IB Diploma Program is designed to establish a standard for international education and cultivate the skills necessary to succeed at the university level. The two-year program provides juniors and seniors with a well-rounded curriculum, promotes international mindedness, and emphasizes service learning. Students who successfully complete this comprehensive international curriculum are well prepared for post-secondary education and are routinely accepted to top colleges and universities throughout the world.

The IB Diploma Program is best suited for students who think

critically, desire rigorous academics, and are committed to personal growth both inside and outside the classroom. Students enrolled in the program have the opportunity to earn an internationally recognized IB Diploma in addition to their Country Day diploma.

English as a Second Language

Country Day offers international students the opportunity to learn the language skills necessary to succeed both academically and socially. Students are recommended for ESL based on an interview, an oral English proficiency test, and listening, vocabulary, and reading comprehension tests.

ESL classes are designed to meet the learning needs of each student and allow them to work at their own ability and level. Upper School students are offered Intermediate and Advanced ESL instruction, in addition to ESL American History, ESL World History.
