Walled Lake Central is a Walled Lake Consolidated School District comprehensive high school for grades nine through twelve. Central is fully accredited by the North Central Association of Schools and Colleges. The school year consists of two semesters of eighteen weeks each (180 student days) with a modified six-period block schedule.

Walled Lake Central has a unique, diverse student population with the typical class size of 33. Over 52 languages are spoken amongst our student body. Five Counselors help to meet the varied needs of our stu-

The school district is located 30 miles northwest of Detroit in southwestern Oakland County and encompasses more than 55 square miles, including all or part of nine governmental units. Residents may take advantage of many recreational and cultural opportunities. Walled Lake Consolidated Schools consists of twelve elementary schools, four middle schools, and three comprehensive high schools.
