Trinity Classical Academy was founded in 2001 with a vision to provide a rigorous college-preparatory education, steeped in the classical tradition, taught through a distinctly Christian worldview.

Though a daunting task, that dream became a mission, and from the start God was obviously with us. He brought passionate people to Trinity, and provided expert guidance from others who had also started Christian schools. He gave our founding leadership a vision for a TK-12 school that would be a shining light in the Santa Clarita Valley.

After some years of planning, we opened with 28 students in kindergarten through 2nd grade. We were small and humble, but from the first day everyone could tell there was something new and exciting about this school. Students were learning at an incredible pace and they were growing in knowledge of God every step of the way.

Word began to spread that there was a new Christian school in town that was producing amazing results. New families began to enroll.

Each year we added another grade level and more families came.

Trinity Distinctives

TRIED AND TRUE METHODS PRODUCE SUCCESS

THE TRIVIUM



At Trinity, the goal of education is to teach children how to think and learn for themselves. Children must be given the tools of learning and taught to apply them to any subject they encounter. We have found that a return to the classical method of teaching accomplishes this goal. In contrast, modern education generally tends to teach subject-specific skills.

The ancient and Medieval school curriculum taught three basic tools of learning known as the Trivium:

GRAMMAR: The fundamental rules and core knowledge of each subject.

LOGIC: The ordered and logical relationship of particulars in each subject.

RHETORIC: How the grammar and logic of each subject may be clearly communicated.

The grammar of a subject is its basic facts and fundamental rules. The grammar of math includes the numbering system and basic math facts. The grammar of history is names, dates and places The grammar of English includes phonics, vocabulary and spelling rules.

The logic of a subject is how its grammar fits together logically. The logic of math is algebra and geometry. The logic of history involves understanding the how and why of names, dates and places, including understanding reasons for wars, migrations, cultural movements and political revolutions. The logic of English includes understanding the parts of speech and the proper construction of sentences and compositions.

The rhetoric of a subject is its articulation, expression and application. The rhetoric of history includes developing and effectively communicating views about political science and cultural trends. The rhetoric of English includes writing effective essays, debating techniques and public speaking

The Trivium is a tried and tested approach to learning. The classical method will equip our children with the necessary tools to master whatever subject they encounter in life.

READING AND PHONICS

Students are reading by December of their kindergarten year at Trinity.

Research in the areas of neuroscience, memory, and effective teaching and learning strategies all point to specific methods that best teach students to read. At Trinity we use Shurley English, a dynamic, rigorous English curriculum for grades K–8. It features powerful strategies that are supported by extensive research. This type of quality instruction helps students internalize key concepts that become an important part of their literacy development. The expectation at Trinity is that students are reading by October of their kindergarten year and with Shurley English we are meeting that benchmark with nearly all of our students.

WRITING

Trinity uses the Progymnasmata, an ancient methodology that teaches students to become eloquent, persuasive writers.

The progymnasmata (Greek for "preliminary exercises") begins, for all students, with the simple retelling of fables and short narrative stories. From there, the student gradually moves on to exercises in simple exposition and persuasion. Each exercise features a fixed outline and carefully specified subject matter. The more advanced exercises of the progymnasmata combine elements of the earlier exercises to create increasingly complex, effective compositions. By the time students have reached the advanced progymnasmata, they have developed clarity of expression, beauty of style, excellent compositional habits, and the ability to write confidently for a variety of purposes.

MATHEMATICS

Trinity uses proven methods to teach math.

Trinity teachers (TK – 6th grade) introduced a new math curriculum in the 2013-2014 school year. Math in Focus is a curriculum based on the popular and proven-successful Singapore Math curriculum. This comprehensive curriculum places a strong emphasis on problem solving and model drawing, with a focus on in-depth understanding so students succeed at math at an early age.







METAMORPHOSIS

Ovid's magnum opus chronicles the history of the world from a pagan perspective. The Latin narrative chronicles the history of the world from its

creation to the deification of Julius Caesar within a loose mythic-historical framework. One of the most influential works in Western culture, the Metamorphoses has inspired such authors as Dante, Boccaccio, Chaucer, and Shakespeare.

Homer

A cornerstone of the Western canon, Homer's sprawling epic poem recounts the adventures of the Greek hero Odysseus during his ten-year voyage to return to his home in Ithaca

after the Trojan War. Mortal men play out their fate under the gaze of the Gods and Homer sings of both death and glory. Odysseus might be the greatest of all literary heroes. He embodies the full range of human potential from physical strength, endurance, courage and ferocity to wit, inventiveness, duplicity, humor and athleticism. He is probably the most fully realized human character in fiction, and he needs all the resources of what it means to be most fully human to return to his family.

PARADISE LOST

John Milton

In his seminal work recounting the epic Fall of Man, Milton seeks to follow man to "justify the ways of God to men" and elucidate the conflict between God's eternal foresight and free will.

Written in 1667 in ten books, it is comprised of ten thousand lines of verse. It is the first epic to integrate both Christian and traditional epic conventions as well as drawing from both Christian and pagan sources. The poem concerns the Biblical story of the Fall of Man: the temptation of Adam and Eve by the fallen angel Satan and their expulsion from the Garden of Eden. Milton's purpose, stated in Book I, is to "justify the ways of God to men".



PHAEDO

Plato

The Phaedo contains the first extended discussion of the Theory of Forms, four arguments for the immortality of the soul, and strong arguments in favor of the

philosophical life. It is considered a seminal work which has become deeply ingrained in Western philosophy and theology.


