# Who is currently authorized to teach Transitional Kindergarten (TK)?







## Transitional Kindergarten (TK)

Transitional Kindergarten teachers must possess a teaching credential, just like kindergarten teachers

Credentials that authorize services are:

Kindergarten-Primary	Specialist Instruction in Early Childhood Ed
Elementary (grades K through 8)	Multiple Subject – <i>GELAP</i>
Early Childhood (preschool through grade 3)	Multiple Subject – <i>STSP</i>
Multiple Subject (preschool, K – 12 and adults)	Multiple Subject - <i>PIP</i>
Multiple Subject University <i>Intern</i>	Emergency Transitional Kindergarten (ETK) Permit





## Transitional Kindergarten (TK)

Transitional Kindergarten (TK) is part of the K-12 public school system and is the first year of a two-year kindergarten program that uses a modified kindergarten curriculum that is age and developmentally appropriate

TK is <u>NOT</u> considered a preschool program and must be taught by an educator who holds a credential that authorized <u>kindergarten</u>

Children who are in a TK move on to Kindergarten class the following school year





#### CDE's Transitional Kindergarten (TK)

Education Code section 48000(g) requires credentialed teachers who are first assigned to a TK classroom after July 1, 2015, to have one of the following by August 1, 2023:

- At least 24 units in Early Childhood, child development, or both
- Professional experience in a classroom setting with preschool age children comparable to the 24 units of education described in Bullet 1
- Child Development Teacher Permit issued by the CTC

Any teacher who is or was assigned to teach TK, or a combination of kindergarten and TK, on or before *July 1, 2015*, is "grandfathered in" to teach TK



#### Special Education Transitional Kindergarten (TK)

 Education Specialist Instruction Credential holders can teach the first year of a two-year kindergarten program in special education classes.
 They are NOT authorized to teach traditional TK because they are not authorized to teach GENERAL education students.

If teaching in a Special Education setting, educators are authorized to teach.

• The older Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) credential does not authorize Special Ed TK because this document does not authorize Kindergarten.

Can apply for "Bridge" document to add Kindergarten





#### TK Special Education

Early Childhood Special Education Credential (ECSE)

- Current credential holders are NOT eligible to teach TK special education
- Current credential seekers (as of July 2022) ARE eligible for TK

Education Specialist Credential - If Kinder is authorized, then eligible to teach TK Special Education because TK is now the 1st year of a 2-year Kinder program (can not teach TK General Education)





## TK Special Education

Early Childhood Special Education Credential (ECSE)

Current ECSE credential holders can upgrade to the new ECSE authorization that allows teaching TK and Kindergarten.

- Verify that they have met the new Teaching Performance Expectation (TPE) content to apply for the expanded ECSE authorization. Verified by completion of one of the following:
  - coursework
  - professional development
  - demonstrated competence and experience
    - An employer, preparation program, or SELPA can <u>verify</u> completion of the content.
- Available as of January 1, 2023



## What are the Teaching Qualification Options?

#### TK Teacher Qualifications - Overview

Bachelor's Degree



Multiple Subject Credential

(if school/districts is using TK funding apportionment)

PK-3 Credential Estimated to begin in 2023-2024

## Earn a Multiple Subject Credential:

#### **Education**

- Bachelor's degree
- Credential program

#### **Testing**

- Basic Skills
   Requirement
   (CBEST or alternative option)
- CSET or degree in Liberal Studies
- TPA
- RICA

#### **Pathway**

- BA + credential program
- Traditional post-BA credential
- Intern Program (BA must be complete)

Add:

24 CD/ECE units to teach PK or TK for schools/districts using TK funding apportionment

## Earn a P-3 credential (not yet available):

#### **Education:**

- Bachelor's degree
- Credential program

#### Testing:

- CBEST (Basic Skills Requirement) - NO
- CSET NO....instead
  - O 24 CD/ECE units
    OR
  - o BA in Child Development or Early Childhood Education
- Teaching Performance Assessment (TPA)
- Reading Competence (RICA)

#### **Pathway**

- BA + credential program
   unknown
- Traditional post-BA credential coming
- Intern Program coming

## PK-3 Specialist Authorization Statement

- This credential authorizes the holder to teach all subjects in a self-contained general education classroom setting and to team teach or to regroup students across classrooms, in preschool through grade three.
- The English Learner (EL) authorization provided through this credential aligns with the EL authorization that is earned upon completion of a Single, Multiple, or Education Specialist teaching program.
- Eligible to add Bilingual Authorization

## Clinical Practice Requirements

- Candidates must complete 600 hours of clinical practice split into two different settings:
  - 200 hours Preschool (PK) or TK setting
  - 200 hours in K-3 setting
  - 200 hours in setting of choice (PK-3)
- Programs must waive at least 200 hours of PK-TK clinical practice for candidates with 6+ years of ECE Teaching Experience
  - Programs may waive up to an additional 200 hours of PK/TK clinical practice experience at their discretion

## "I Hold a Multiple Subject Credential":

#### **Option 1**

24 CD/ECE units to teach P-3 (includes TK)

#### **Option 2**

Child Development Teacher Permit

OR

Early Childhood Education Specialist credential

(Previously issued credential - different than the new PK-3 Early Childhood Education Specialist Instruction Credential — can no longer be obtain but educators may still renew if they have it)

#### **Option 3**

Professional experience in a classroom setting with preschool age children comparable to 24 CD/ECE units (as determined by employing agency)

Applicable only for schools/districts using TK funding apportionment

## Site Supervisor Permit - School Age Emphasis

One child development permit option for Multiple Subject (MS) Credential holders

- Bachelor's Degree or higher
- Supervised Field Experience class (student teaching from MS credential program)
- 12 Semester Unit of Coursework (6 from MS credential Program and 6 in Child Development)

PRO: Fewer units required

CON: Must renew permit every five years

#### "I Have a BA and 24 ECE Units"

P-3 credential (24 ECE units satisfies the subject matter requirement)

#### OR

Multiple Subject credential (need CSET or BA in Liberal Studies)

\*Effective July 1, 2022 - An employer-driven emergency permit/authorization Emergency Specialist Teaching Permit in Early Childhood Education is possible.





#### **Pros and Cons:**

## Multiple Subjects Credential:

- Available now
- Requires CSET or BA in Liberal Studies
- Requires CBEST or applicable coursework
- Allow you to teach more grade levels

#### P-3 Credential:

- Not yet available
- 24 ECE units or experience instead of CSET
- CBEST not required
- Only allowed to teach in lower grades
- 6 or more years of field experience shortens clinical practice requirement





#### Early Childhood/Child Development Units

- Any regionally accredited community college or university
- Course must be labeled as being an Early Childhood or Child Development course
  - Ex: CHIL101 Human Growth and Development (Mesa)
  - Ex: ECE 210 Child, Family, School and Community (NU)
- Note: Montessori school coursework/experience is not applicable
  - CEU units are not applicable SDCOE does not advise on course registration





## **Emergency TK Permit**

**Emergency Transitional Kindergarten Permit (ETK) FAQs** 

Effective July 1, 2022 - Emergency Transitional Kindergarten (ETK) Permit (aka: Emergency Specialist Teaching Permit in Early Childhood Education)

- Only available at the request of employing agency
- CL-908 Form Verification of Requirements for the Emergency Transitional Kindergarten (ETK) permit





## **Emergency TK Permit**

**Emergency** Transitional Kindergarten (ETK) Permit Requirements:

- BA or higher from regionally accredited college or university
- Possess a valid Child Development Teacher Permit or higher
- Satisfy one of the following:
  - 24 semester units in Child Development or ECE
  - Possession of a BA or higher degree in CD or ECE
  - Beginning July 1, 2023, must have 3 or more years of FT teaching in TK setting or preschool/CD program or combo
