

Northmont Students Prepared For the Future

Northmont students have been preparing for their future by earning college credits and receiving industry-recognized credentials while attending high school. Below is a chart showing the percentage of students who have earned college credits during their high school career over the past four years. The percentage of Northmont students earning these credits continues to outpace the average percentage at the state and county level.



Northmont students have also had the opportunity to earn industry-recognized credentials through programs such as the State Tested Nursing Assistant (STNA), Welding courses, Pre-Apprenticeships, and others. Between 2016 and 2021, 421 students earned an industry-recognized credential while at Northmont.

High School Academic Challenge Team Continues Excellence

The Northmont Academic Challenge team has had a very successful 2022-2023 season, and is gearing up for three national competitions in April, May,

and June. Academic Challenge is a team-based Jeopardy competition in which teams of four compete on all subjects across the academic curriculum. This year, the team is ranked third in the state of Ohio, has won six tournaments, and swept the GWOC undefeated!

The team opened the year with wins over two national Top 100 teams at a tournament in Glasgow, KY before knocking off rival Beavercreek (for the first of 11 times this year!) at the Miami Valley School Invitational. In November, the team won their first two tournaments of the year at Beavercreek and Little Miami High Schools. In January, Northmont won a National History Bowl tournament at Tippecanoe, qualifying for the National Championship in Washington DC. The team then traveled to Lincoln, IL where they posted a perfect 10-0 record against the best teams in Southern Illinois. In January, Northmont swept Beavercreek in the GWOC to finish the season 12-0 in the conference, winning our 27th conference title! In March, the team finished 3rd at the NAQT Ohio State championship, our highest finish since winning the state title in 2015. Given that the team has no seniors, Northmont will open the 2023-2024 season ranked #1 in the state!

Over spring break, junior captain Ave Rieger, junior Adam Williams, and sophomore Ethan Kral competed in NAQT's Individual Player National Championship. This competition pitted 200 of the top players in the country against each other in individual competition. Ave Rieger finished 35th in the nation, with Adam Williams 52nd and Ethan Kral 58th. Northmont was one of just two teams nationally to place three players in the Top 60 in the country. In late April, the team will compete in the History Bowl National Championship in Washington DC, before traveling to Atlanta and Chicago for all subject National tournaments.

All Northmont students grade 7-12 are invited to participate in the Academic Challenge team. The Middle School team practices on Wednesdays and is coached by Northmont alumni (and Jeopardy! contestant) Emily Bingham. The High School team practices after school on Mondays and Fridays and is coached by social studies teacher David Jones. Science Olympiad Teams Soar



The high school Science Olympiad team hosted the first in-person tournament in the last five years and it was a huge success! Northmont hosted 22 teams, including last year's national tournament winner. The return to "normal" included opportunities to compete with the top teams around the country at major universities like the University of Michigan and Notre Dame, as well as at Solon High School and Raymond Park. At the Regional tournament, Northmont students received medals in 21 individual events and placed 2nd among all of the teams in our region. Northmont Science Olympiad Team will be competing at the state tournament on April 29. According to teacher and coach Jessica Pahl, "These kids are hardworking, resilient, tenacious and utterly brilliant. The community should be incredibly proud of them!"

Northmont Middle School also boasts a talented Science Olympiad team representing students in grades 6-9. This team also qualified for the state tournament with two groups placing 4th and 9th at the regional competition. According to Christy Asbra, "Regionals was definitely a fun day watching our kids work hard, get nervous, power through frustration, and then come back from their event with fun stories and triumph of their fears. It is so neat watching them go through these experiences and grow!"


