
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So what's a positive outlier?...

Last spring, ODE partnered with researchers from the Ohio Education Research Center at Ohio State, and chose only 25 schools from across Ohio to study their teaching methods and supports. Researchers visited just 25 school buildings, and 3 of them were our elementary schools: Robinwood Lane, Stadium Drive and West Boulevard Elementaries—Each is a Positive Outlier.

Researchers talked with our principals, teachers, counselors, technology aides, and even school nurses to see what we are doing, and how other schools in Ohio can model our successful strategies as best practices.



BGJHS is one of only 250 schools across the country with the highly respected Bryt Program in place.

Bryt helps students struggling with mental health, addiction, or family trauma that jeopardizes their ability to remain in school successfully.

A full-time clinical counselor and an academic instructor work together in a welcoming classroom setting at Glenwood. More than 40 students have transitioned back into general classes successfully since the program's inception in the Fall of 2021. (Partially funded by Mahoning County Mental Health Board)

## **BOARDMAN HIGH SCHOOL**



Several students in BHS's Pre-apprenticeship Woods Program earned skilled trades scholarships in 2023. They also built a sturdy legacy: a maroon storage shed for the high school recycling program. Digital art skills and marketing know-how helped BHS freshman Dimitra Coutris win YCAR's Banner Contest. BHS Art Department earned a \$3,500 Grant, and Dimitra won \$100 of her own. Dimitra's artwork was displayed outside YCAR's Boardman office.

#### REFEREE PROGRAM IS A GO



BHS will have a new elective in 2023-24: Sports Officiating. The semester-long class would encompass football, volleyball, and soccer officiating in the fall, followed by winter and spring sports in the second semester. The training involves both classroom learning and hands-on experience. The goal is to enable students to be certified and to pursue officiating as a career option.

# **NEW TECH**New Opportunities

A \$15,000 ESC Careers Grant provided 7 new drones for Boardman High School.

This includes professional training for our teachers and will open the door for our students to eventually get FAA remote pilot credentials as well as flight training and ground school certifications.



#### FINANCIAL ACCOUNTABILITY



In the last three years, Federal ESSER funds have enabled the district to extend air conditioning to all school buildings. It improves air quality, ventilation, and the overall learning environment for students and staff. (see completion timetable below) LED lighting upgrades to the exterior of every school building and all parking lots are now complete and provide an extra layer of safety. Annual savings from LED conversion: \$18,000.



# **Building & Safety Improvements**

#### AIR CONDITIONING:

- All 3 elementary schools are now fully air conditioned to start the new school year
- BCIS 3rd floor cafeteria tentative Fall, 2023
- Center portable classroom units to begin installation with completion by Spring, 2024
- Glenwood Jr. High electric grid prepared for full school air conditioning in Spring of 2024

#### **SUMMER UPDATES INCLUDE:**

- West: new sound panels installed in gym
- Stadium: cafeteria painted and new Spartan privacy films on entry doors (provided by PTA)
- Robinwood: roof partially replaced with permanent improvement funds:\$222,000
- Glenwood: new wheelchair ramp for gym

BHS: new cafeteria tables and interior LEDs **CENTER INTERMEDIATE:** Spring windstorm damage to Center's roof and auditorium were addressed by replacing the roof, and repairing the ceiling in the Auditorium. The auditorium was fully repainted. That cost was fully covered through insurance for the severe weather event.

#### **Boardman Food Services Healthy Standard**



Food Services Supervisor Natalie Winkle tested a hydroponic "Flex Farm" in 2023, to grow fresh heads of lettuce in her office. It produced hundreds of salads in the BHS cafeteria!

Now, in the coming school year, Flex Farms will be added at BCIS and BGJHS, so the students can help produce and then enjoy eating what they grow.

A second growing project with the new BHS Garden Club transformed an unused courtyard space into a pesticide-free sustainable garden!

#### "Tot Chef"

A new \$2,500 Grant will help reinstitute the former "Tot Chef" afterschool program in 2023–24

The Boardman Schools Fund for Educational Excellence awarded 11 teacher grants last year worth a total of over \$18,000. With some assistance from the district, an additional 8 projects were fully funded. This has been our largest group of grant winners yet! BSFEE has awarded over \$100,000 since its inception in 2009.
