#### Information for AP Students

Attention all AP students, create your CollegeBoard account and join your AP Google Classrooms if you haven't already! If you need help with your log on, please contact Mrs. Millette.

Guidance is now collecting the \$40 per exam non-refundable down payment for your Advanced Placement Exam(s). The deadline to make your deposit is **Friday, November 2nd**. Payments of cash or check (made payable to ORRHS) will be accepted in the guidance office. If you miss this deadline, an additional \$40 per exam late fee will be added to your exam cost. The full cost per exam is \$98 with the exception of Seminar and Research, which is \$146 per exam. If you qualify for Free or Reduced lunch and would like to apply for a waiver, you must contact Guidance prior to Friday, November 2nd, for approval. Students that are approved to receive a waiver will be responsible for a payment of \$15 per exam, due by November 2nd to avoid the \$40 per exam late fee. NACAC fairs will also feature MatchMaking! At the time of registration, you will select the attributes that




# **Upcoming College Rep Visits for Juniors and Seniors**
