

**CLEAR CREEK ISD APPROVED HONORS COURSES FOR NO PASS, NO PLAY EXEMPTION**

Students will be granted a one-time waiver for one nine-week grading period for one course if they fail an Honors/AP course with a grade of 60-69 percent. Each student will only be eligible for one waiver for one course per academic year. This list reflects every course that qualifies for this one-time waiver. All dual credit courses included on CCISD’s Dual Credit Crosswalk in English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, and World Languages and Cultures are to be included in this exemption list.

**Appendix B: Extracurricular Activities and UIL Eligibility, Honors Advanced Class Waivers**

Clear Creek ISD values academic rigor and relevance in student course work and upholds higher standards than the UIL in regards to grade exemptions in Honors and Advanced level course work. Students will be granted a one-time waiver for one nine week grading period for one course if they fail an Honors/AP course with a grade of 60-69 percent. Students will only be eligible for one waiver for one course per academic year, beginning with the first nine weeks. **Students in Honors/AP courses will not lose eligibility during the first six week grading period.**

**University Interscholastic League (UIL) Eligibility**  
**Eligibility for All Extracurricular Participants After First Six Weeks of the School Year**  
(Refer to <https://www.uil texas.org/policy/tea-uil-side-by-side> )

- A student who receives, at the end of any grading period (after the first six weeks of the school year), a grade below 70 in any class (other than an identified class eligible for exemption) or a student with disabilities who fails to meet the standards in the Individual Education Plan (IEP) may not participate in extracurricular activities for three school weeks. An ineligible student may practice or rehearse, however. The student regains eligibility after the seven-calendar day waiting period has ended following a grading period or the three school week evaluation period when the principal and teachers determine that he or she has earned a passing grade (70 or above) in all classes, other than those that are exempted.
- All schools must check grades for all participants at the end of the first six weeks of the school year. From that point, grades are checked at the end of each nine-week grading period. Students who pass remain eligible until the end of the next grading period.
- All activity coaches and directors are responsible for obtaining official grade reports from the individual the principal designates as the keeper of official grades before the student represents the school. This provision applies to all grading periods. It also applies to all three-school week evaluation periods for ineligible students.
