Chromebook Distribution

I'm please to report while we're just one week into the school year, we've issued over 700 devices to students. With that said, we are hoping to see that number increase in the coming days and weeks.

As a reminder, students will need a school-issued device for all district and state testing this year -- which is fast approaching on Wednesday, October 11 -- so we do strongly urge every student to pick up a Chromebook.

If your child still needs a device, please take some time to complete the proper paperwork through the PowerSchool Parent Portal. Alternatively, we also have paper forms in The Main Office (Admin I) that students can pick up and bring home for your review and signature. Families may purchase insurance for \$15 to cover accidental damage, but this is not required for your student to receive a device.

October 11: District and State Testing at SHS (Grades 9-11) and the Senior Financial Literacy Fair

On Wednesday, October 11, students in grades 9, 10, and 11, will participate in district and state tests:

- Ninth Graders: iReady Assessment for Reading and Math
- Tenth Graders: Maine Educational Assessment (NWEA) for Reading and Math
- Eleventh Graders: PSAT Testing

Relatedly, our Seniors will be participating in a Senior Financial Literacy Fair, which is put in in partnership with Town and Country Credit Union.

AI and ChatGPT

Before signing off, I also wanted to make a brief statement to families and students regarding AI and ChatGPT.

Though the year has just begun, teachers have already reported seeing a few assignments that they've suspected were generated by using AI technology, likely ChatGPT. While this technology is tremendously powerful, and is sure to have a lasting impact on the world in ways we can't yet predict, I want to acknowledge here and now that submitting assignments partially or wholly generated using AI are regarded as acts of Academic Dishonesty under our SHS Student Handbook. Though we always try to educate and support students in these instances, there are consequences, some potentially farreaching, for such violations.

As is the case in schools and colleges across the country currently, and as has frequently been the case when new educational technology rapidly emerges, we are having many healthy and constructive internal discussions as a staff about how to use this tool to further teaching and learning and improve educational outcomes for all students. However, as we take some time to work through how to best adapt to this new technology, teachers and staff are putting a variety of measures in place to ensure the academic integrity of student work.
