# ECKLIST

#### **Grade 11: Required**

- Update your High School Course Plan in Schoology to map out the courses you intend to take for grades 11 through 12, to ensure you have a plan to meet graduation requirements and your post-secondary goals.
- Where: Advisory/Schoology
- When: February/March
- Supporter: Advisor
- Review the high school course catalog, work with your high school counselor to select your courses for 12th grade.
- Where: TPS website and Advisorv
- When: February/March
- Supporter: Advisor
- Create a current resume or activity log that provides a written compilation of your education, any work experience, and any community service and how the school district recognized the community service.
- Where: Advisory or designated subject
- When: Second Semester
- Supporter: Teacher
- If taking a Career and Technical Education (CTE) course, teachers will assist students to complete verification at the conclusion of each semester to receive dual credit (high school and college credit).
- Where: CTE Courses
- · When: End of Course
- Supporter: CTE Teacher

- If you have the College Bound Scholarship, review requirements and repledge your commitment so that you can access your scholarship.
- Where: Advisory
- When: October
- Supporter: Advisor/School Counselor
- Take the PSAT for free during the school day and potentially qualify for the National Merit and other scholarships.
- Where: At school
- When: October
- Supporter: Teacher/School Administrator
