





Learning and Memory




- Learning is building knowledge in our long-term memory
- When we first learn information, we hold it in our working memory, but this can only hold small amounts of information
- To learn, we need to keep knowledge in our long-term memory
- Retrieval Practice helps us to do this
- This is when we deliberately recall information to see what we know
- Retrieval Practice is key to learning at Sydenham School









Studying and revising



- Reading over notes is not an effective form of studying
- A more effective technique is for students to put everything away and test themselves on what they know
- This builds a stronger working memory
- This is a blank paper exercise or brain dump



Supporting your child

Quiz your daughter or son using their flashcards. Give them plenty of time to answer. The more they struggle, the better for memory. Make a list of all the important information you need to know from a particular unit or chapter.

Why read 20 minutes at home?







- Maths fluency eg. times tables is key to success






