GIRLS SOCCER - Crockett came into this game with a 5-1-1 record and a couple of lopsided wins, but Coach Stan Jamscek knew their toughest opponents had yet to appear. Monday began the parade, as Madison Academic schooled the Lady Cavaliers 5-1 by controlling the ball better than 90% of the time.


So dominant was Madison that Crockett got only one shot at the goal in the entire first half – and it went in the net. Senior Ester Procopio took a pass from right wing Avery Thornton and hammered it home to cut the Lady Mustangs lead to 2-1 and perhaps swing the momentum, but that hope was short-lived as Madison's Ava Torres scored the second of her first-half goals shortly thereafter.

The visitors added two more tallies in the final half as Crockett again struggled just to make more than one pass before the Lady Mustangs intercepted and switched directions. Only an occasional save by goaltender Hannah Johnson or a defensive turnaway by Dani Rios, Casey Thornton, and Chayse Lewis prevented the margin from growing even larger.

"We just played way too soft," was Jamscek's succinct summary of his club's effort. It won't get any easier for Crockett Tuesday as the Lady Cavs travel to Martin to take on talented Westview.

MIDDLE SCHOOL SOFTBALL - Coach Duke Kail's CCMS squad won its sixth consecutive game, hammering neighboring Milan 13-0 in a contest mercifully ended after just two-and-a-half innings.


Crockett scored six runs in the first and seven in the second to post a high-enough number to trigger the mercy rule after three Milan series of at-bats. None of those took very long, as Emmalynn Medlin limited the Lady Bulldogs to one hit over the three frames, without issuing a walk.

Meanwhile, Medlin was also leading the Lady Cav parade around the bases, going 3-for-3 with a double and three RBIs. Catcher Macie Teel had a triple among her two hits, and joined teammates Wesley Thornton, Haley Leforgee, and Ella Hayes with two runs driven in apiece. Leforgee collected two hits, and Fallon Beaird and Nataly Amador also knocked in runs for the winners, who are now 9-2 for the season.


