## **\*RAA Parent and Student Agreements 2023-24**

Please read each of these agreements carefully. These agreements are not suggestions. No matter the program that your student is applying or registering for, these boundaries are adhered to for the consistency and focus that is required by our students.

### **PT and School Upkeep**

Physical Training and cleaning responsibilities are a part of all programs at the RAA campus. PT and other typical school upkeep may also be utilized in discipline assignments.

### **Student Dress Code**

The student dress code at the RAA campus is designed with consideration to the requirements of each program. Students will be required to abide by the following:

- \*\*Wear appropriately fitted clothing, no sagging pants (please wear a belt if necessary)
- \*\*No exposed legs above the knee
- \*\*No hooded sweatshirts, t-shirts, sweaters, or jackets/coats of any kind
- \*\*No durags, bonnets, turbans, or the likeness
- \*\*No sunglasses
- \*\*No pajamas or house shoes/slippers
- \*\*No slides, sandals, or rubber shoes (e.g. Crocs)
- \*\*No sleeveless, see-through, or spaghetti strap shirts or tops
- \*\*No midriff or half-shirts
- \*\*No disrespectful or inappropriate printed clothing of any kind
- \*\*Dressing in layers is suggested as temperatures of rooms and outside may fluctuate

**RRA/BOOT Dress Code:** Black-on-Black workout attire with tennis shoes, no jewelry, no leggings

**REIP Dress Code:** workout attire with tennis shoes, no jewelry

**\*\*Administration and Staff reserve the right to determine or further define if a student is dressed outside the boundaries of modesty, inappropriately, or a matter of nuisance or harm to self or others.**

## **Disciplinary Procedures**

Every attempt is made to create and maintain a positive atmosphere at the RAA site. Since traditional disciplinary tactics have been generally unsuccessful with students in these programs, a different approach is used. Students are required to sign a student agreement before they are registered at the RAA site. With this document, students agree: **(1)** not to use or possess tobacco, alcohol, illicit drugs, or any other harmful substance on school property or while participating in school-related activities and not to come to school while under the influence of these substances, **(2)** not to participate in violence or threats of violence or to use or possess any type of weapon on school property or while participating in school-related activities, **(3)** to attend school regularly and be in class on time, **(4)** to participate in classroom activities as the teachers ask, **(5)** to respect classmates, school employees, and school property, and **(6)** to abide by the same rules as regular education students when at regular education buildings or activities.

Discipline measures may include REIP Placement, RRA Placement, OSS, Community Service, Counseling, UA tests, Physical Training, School Upkeep Responsibilities, Monetary Reparations, a combination of any of these, and other common forms of behavior modification activities of these likenesses.

Every effort will be made to contact a parent/guardian for the purpose of assigning discipline to their student. If a parent cannot be reached, staff will contact others from the student's contact list. If parents or guardians have any questions or concerns, the first call should be to the RAA principal for clarification or to set up a meeting.

The contract also stipulates that each student's continued attendance in these Alternative programs is to be reassessed periodically and that students may be

involuntarily sent to or referred elsewhere if this agreement is violated. Supplemental contracts may be created to address individual situations. Through this system, students understand that they may remain in their respective Alternative program only as long as they are willing to obey these rules and make steady progress toward academic success and/or graduation.

## **Attendance Requirements**

*The need for consistent school attendance is stressed in the Alternative program. The student agreement with the school dictates that students will attend regularly.*

*Students should understand that they are not allowed to miss school for frivolous reasons and that unexcused absences severely jeopardize their continued participation specifically in the RAA program and may affect a student's enrollment status in the district.*

*Whenever a student is absent, his or her parent or legal guardian should telephone the school as soon as possible to report this absence. If a parent or guardian fails to telephone the school, the school will attempt to make contact. If no contact is made between the parent and the school, the absence will be counted as TRUANT(TR). If a parent contact is made and the parent is aware of the student's absence, the absence will be coded as a PARENT CONTACT(PC). Be aware: TR and PC are NOT excused absences.*

**Four (4) or more unexcused absences that are full days or any part of a day will result in a notification to Campus Police and imminent delivery of a truancy citation to the student's parent or guardian.**

*If a student persists in being late to school, his or her driving privilege may be revoked and the student may be required to take school bus transportation to classes or to be driven to school by their parents to ensure prompt arrival.*

***Students who do not go to any scheduled class will be coded as TRUANT. This practice can also result in discipline and a report to Campus Police to issue a citation.***

***Students shall not be allowed to leave the school while their classes are in session unless checked out through the main office by a parent or legal guardian. Parents or legal guardians must verify and approve the student's need to leave. Leaving school without permission is classified as truancy and may lead to further discipline.***

**Important Alert:: Doctor or Legal Notes MUST BE TURNED IN WITHIN 4 DAYS OF THE STUDENTS RETURN TO SCHOOL.**

**Important Alert:: A student who accumulates more than 9 absences is in jeopardy of losing any earned credit for their current classes.**

### **Technology**

**Cell Phones and other technology-based items are NOT allowed to be carried by students during school hours. All technology will be checked in upon entering the building and returned to the student upon dismissal. This includes phones, iPads, AirPods, Earbuds, headphones, smart watches, laptops, reading tablets, or other technology of the same likeness.**

**Drug Use-Perceived or Otherwise**

Students shall abide by the following:

**\*\*Do NOT attend school carrying an ODOR of marijuana, tobacco, alcohol, or any other illegal substance--THIS PERTAINS TO A STUDENT'S CLOTHES, BODY, OR ITEMS CARRIED INTO THE SCHOOL.**

**\*\*Do NOT attend school under the influence of marijuana, tobacco, alcohol, or any other illegal substance.**

**\*\*Do NOT attend school carrying paraphernalia used with marijuana, tobacco, alcohol, or any other illegal substance.**

**\*\*Prescribed or Over The Counter medication that the student requires through the day must be checked in at the front office by a parent--not carried on the student.**

**This MPS property is under 24-hour surveillance. All vehicles entering this property are subject to search.**

**Safety sweeps and regular student searches by school staff, canine monitoring, and Campus and/or other government Law Enforcement are regular practices for the health and safety of students and staff. Visitors to campus are also required to comply with these searches if directed.**

**\*\*Non-compliance with a search request will result in discipline for students and a ban from school properties for visitors.**

## **WEAPONS IN THE SCHOOL or PLANNING FOR SUCH**

*It shall be unlawful for any student to transport or to carry upon his/her person, or in his/her portfolio/backpack or purse, any firearm, knife, blade, club, chain, metal knuckles, a device capable of firing a projectile, stun gun, gaseous spray, projectile, explosive device, or any such item that could be used as a weapon while:*

***\*\*On the school grounds at any time, or***

***\*\*Off the school grounds at any school activity, function, or event, or***

***\*\*Being transported in any vehicle being used by the school district.***

***Any student found to be in possession of a dangerous weapon, or planning a dangerous act pertaining to weapons, will be suspended and an alternative learning plan will be assigned. The appropriate authorities will also be notified for further legal investigation.***

## **School Transportation and Student Drivers**

***Permission for any student to ride on a bus is dependent upon his/her good behavior and observance of the following rules and regulations.***

***\*\*Be on time to the bus stop or pick-up point, do not run in front of or after the bus, and wait for the bus to come to a complete stop before trying to board or exit your seat to get off the bus.***

***\*\*Do not be responsible for anything passing through the bus windows, including any parts of the body, any items being carried to/from school, or anything contrary to the rules of good behavior.***

***\*\*The bus driver and all district rules concerning behavior, dress code, drugs/tobacco, weapons, and the like shall be followed and respected from the time that students are at the bus stop until after the student arrives back at the bus stop and is headed home.***

***Riding the bus to or from school is a privilege and not a right. This privilege can be suspended and personal transportation to school may have to be obtained.***

***Students driving on and off campus is also a privilege and can be suspended. Proper paperwork must be filed with the school office before a student begins driving and parking on campus. Not following the rules and regulations for the safety of everyone on campus or driving an unauthorized vehicle on campus could result in discipline and/or the vehicle being towed at the owner's expense.***

# RAA Bus Process

Students riding the bus to school will get on their regular bus and ride it to the following:::

6th and 7th grade–Get off the bus at 67GA and they will direct you from there.

8th and 9th grade–Get off the bus at 89GA (AR) and they will direct you from there.

10th, 11th, and 12th grade– Get off at MHS and they will direct you from there.

When you get to your school and get off the bus, look for the administrator and let them know you are going to RAA. They will put you on the last arriving bus and you will be delivered to RAA.

Do not enter the school while you are waiting on the transfer to RAA. Stay with the administrator.
