
MISSION STATEMENT

ENGLISH AND HISTORY ELECTIVES: St. George's has shifted to in-depth study of specific topics, often interdisciplinary in nature, at the collegiate level. Examples include: 20th Century Europe, Criminal Law and Literature, Currents in Maritime Literature, Race Relations, Social Entrepreneurship, and Sports Journalism.

*During the 2022-2023 school year, Honors classes were the highest level of coursework offered in the Humanities department. In the 2023-2024 school year, Honors Humanities classes have been re-labeled as Advanced courses.

GRADING SYSTEM & ACADEMIC HONORS

CUM LAUDE SOCIETY: Awarded to a small number of upperformers who have a high grade point average, have maintained a rigorous course load throughout their time at SG, are of high moral character, and who have been positive contributors to the community.

TOP FIFTEEN SCHOLARS: Awarded at the opening of the school year to those students who have the highest weighted grade point average across the entire school for the previous school year.

HEAD OF SCHOOL'S COMMENDATION: Awarded at the end of each term to students who have earned all grades A- or higher and all efort marks must be at least "Satisfactory."

HONOR ROLL: Awarded at the end of each term to students who maintain an average of B or better, and all effort marks must be at least "Satisfactory."
