College and Career Readiness - must meet 1 before graduation!

College Readiness:

- 20 or better ACT score
- 1020 or better SAT score
- 3 or better on an AP test
- Complete at least 6 credits of Dual Enrollment in English, Math, or STEM courses with
 - a final grade of a C or better

Career Readiness:

- Become a CATE completer including earning a national industry credential as determined by the business community
- Earn a Silver, Gold, or Platinum on the WIN Test earning a National Certificate
- Earn a composite score of a 31 or higher on the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) test


Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB)

- □ Offered at BLHS 3 times per year: 9/13; 11/28 & 2/6
- Score determines job opportunities in the military

 - Word Knowledge
 - Paragraph Comprehension
 - Mathematics Knowledge
 - Electronics Information

- Who?
 - Anyone who has any interest! Give yourself options - just because you apply, doesn't mean you have to go
- When?
 - Apps should be done by October 31st because:
 - Find out sooner
 - Peace of mind
 - More time for school & Scholarship Apps
 - Financial Aid
 - Keep up with earlier deadlines Oct 15th is College of Charleston & USC-Columbia

- Where?
 - Visit each school website
- How Many?
 - A minimum of 3-5 schools is recommended
 - 1. Dream/Reach School
 - 2. Good Matches
 - 3. Safety/back-up School



College Applications & Financial Aid

Visit college websites (all college websites can be found at <u>www.collegeboard.org</u>). Follow link to college website.

- Click on Admissions
 - Undergraduate Admissions/First time Freshman
 - Complete application for incoming Freshman, undergraduate, Fall 2024
 - We recommend you submit applications no later than October 31st.
 - Request transcript through Parchment <u>after</u> application is submitted
- Apply for Financial Aid, October 1, 2023
 - https://studentaid.gov/
 - You and your parents will need a copy of your 2022 tax returns
 - Complete application and send to colleges in which you applied. The earlier you apply, the more money is available!!

State Lottery Scholarships

Palmetto Fellows Scholarship Qualifying Criteria:

- 3.5 SC UGP GPA
- 1200 SAT/25 ACT
- Top 6% rank at the end of grade 10, 11 or 12

If class rank criteria not met:

- 4.0 SC UGP GPA
- 1400 SAT/31 ACT

\$6,700 for the first year and can go up towards \$10,000



Life Scholarship Qualifying Criteria:

Must meet 2 of 3 Criteria listed if attending a 4- year institution

- 3.0 SC UGP GPA
- Rank if top 30% of graduating class
- Score 1100 SAT/22 ACT

Must meet the 3.0 SC UGP GPA if attending a 2-year institution

\$5,000 per year

SC Hope - 4 year institutions only

• 3.0 SC UGP GPA

State Lottery Grants

SC Need Based Grant

Qualifying Criteria: Determined "in need" by completing the FAFSA

Continued Eligibility Criteria

- 2.0 GPA
- Earn 24 Credit Hours
- Complete the FAFSA annually, so "in need" status can be confirmed.

Lottery Tuition Assistance

Qualifying Criteria: 2-year institutions only

- Complete FAFSA or FASFA Waiver
- Enroll in at least six credit hours

Continued Eligibility Criteria

- Maintain satisfactory academic progress
- After attempting 24 credit hours, maintain a 2.0 GPA
- Complete the FAFSA Annually



Athletic Scholarships

- Who: anyone interested in playing college athletics. Apply through the NCAA for Division I, II, III Schools
- □ <u>When:</u> after successful completion of Junior year
- **Where:** Click on the picture to register on the Eligibility Center
- U We will upload your transcript -SAT and ACT scores are no longer needed
