Boldt is the general contractor and project manager for the Greenheck Turner Community Center. The Youth Apprenticeship program allows students to gain educational experiences across multiple trades and gain industry knowledge for an informed post-graduation career decision. Each apprentice is matched with a mentor who provides opportunities for skills enhancement and career support. Logan has a unique ability, as a high school senior, to consistently problem solve, work around his high school schedule, continue as an athlete playing baseball, and excel as a young adult.

The program encourages students to learn the trades, observe the projects, and be a part of the community where they live and will leave a lasting impression.

Logan is earning school credits through his participation in the State of Wisconsin's Department of Workforce Development Youth Apprenticeship Program available at D.C. Everest High School for participating juniors and seniors. Boldt provides this program as an opportunity to highlight careers in construction and provide pathways into the union of their choice for continued employment at Boldt.

During the school year, Boldt will work with the High School teachers in the Technical Education department to give tours, and allow high school classes to view practical onsite trades as the interiors are installed.

The trades profession can be an excellent opportunity for students as they graduate high school. Skilled youth apprentices can distinguish themselves from their peers when applying for jobs in this high demand field.


FITNESS CENTER & PERSONAL TRAINING

Steel

The steel truss sections are going up at the construction site. The first one weighs approximately 100,000 lbs. and the other 14 are about 65,000 lbs. There are 15 total sections. Three different cranes work together to erect the truss sections allowing the inside ceiling of the turf area to be tall enough for a football kicker to punt and kick with no limitations. In the next few weeks, the roof will be installed and the building will be enclosed for the winter months. Near January the interior work will begin with carpentry, paint, plumbing, and electrical work to ensure the building is open in the Fall of 2024.

All particiant's require a signed waiver on file, participants under 18 years old require parent or guardian permission with signed waiver on file


Vacation Fun Days




Most Wednesday nights in September-October-November. \$5 per child for children age 3-12 years old.
