

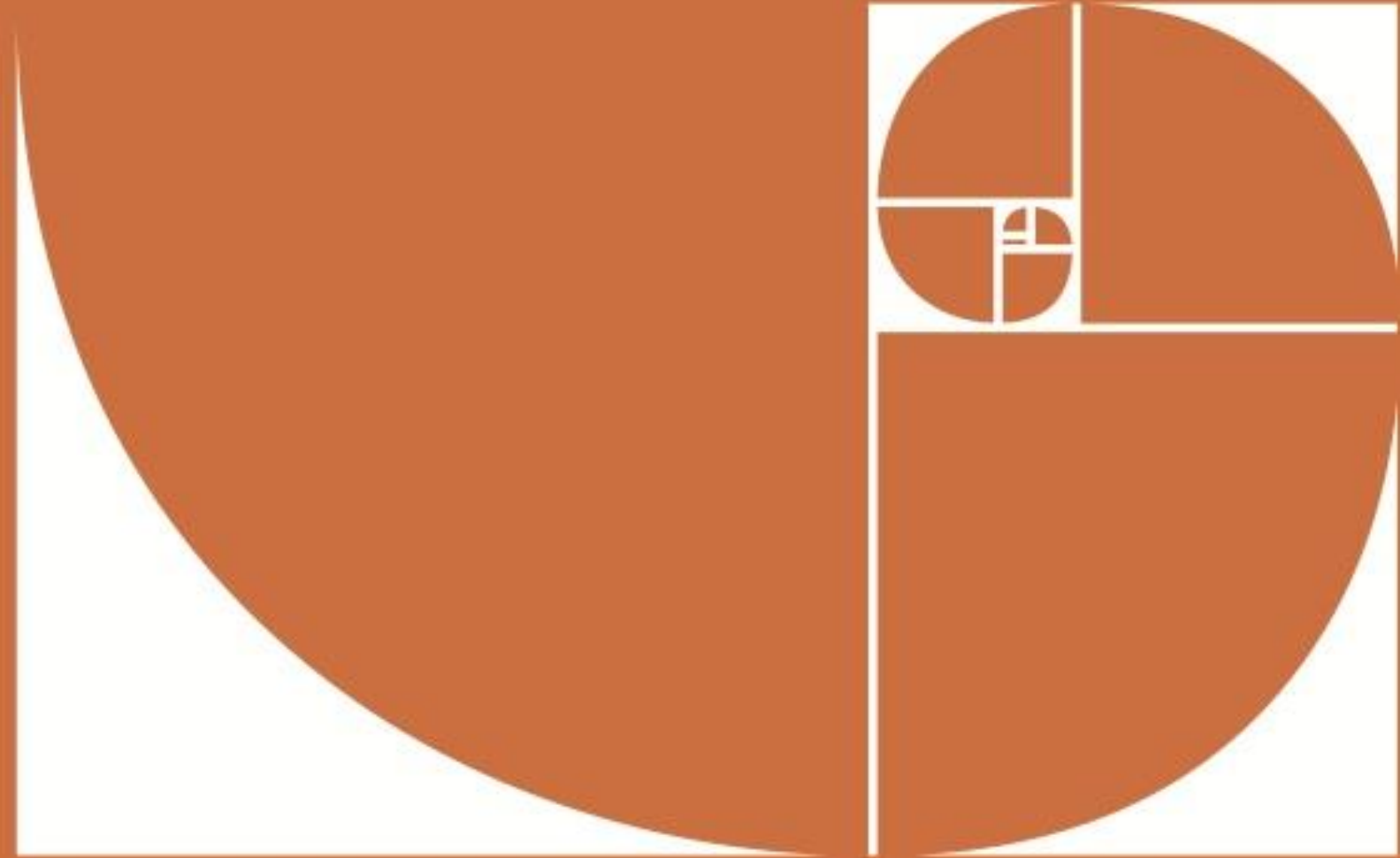

### 2:30-3:30pm Chemistry Down the Drain Poster Session

Come learn from our 10<sup>th</sup> grade student scientists as they present data on water samples they collected in partnership with the University of Utah and the Salt Lake City Water Reclamation Plant.

### 3:00-6:00pm Citizen Science

Bring your own water sample to test and answer a short questionnaire and you will also receive a \$50 VISA gift card. All types of water samples are welcome including tap water, secondary irrigation water, and river water.
