SLCSE Graduation

The class of 2023 will be graduating on June 9th at 5:00 pm at the University of Utah, Libby Gardner Hall at 5pm. Here are some reminders regarding graduation:

- Students must meet state requirements and be cleared to participate in graduation by June 9th. Students will not receive their cap and gown until they are cleared for graduation.
- 2. All graduating students wishing to participate in the ceremony must wear approved graduation regalia which includes the black cap and gown and designated tassel. Additions to graduation regalia should reflect culturally significant objects to the students, families, and their communities. Students may decorate their cap. Modifications to the gown cannot alter the overall appearance. Any additions cannot include representations of drugs, violence, political speech, hate speech, or other non-religious or non-culturally significant objects.
- 3. Please refrain from bringing any items that may leave a mess behind (no confetti, confetti cannons, poppers, etc.)

We thank you in advance for adhering to these expectations and look forward to celebrating this huge milestone with you and your senior soon!
