





The goal of WEB, Boomerang Project's middle school orientation and transition program, is to provide schools with a structure in which students make real connections with each other thus increasing school safety and reducing incidence of bullying. Through this program, students learn that people at school care about them and their success.

WEB is a middle school transition program that increases student achievement, enhances character development efforts and creates an anti-bullying environment at our school.

What does WEB look like at Oak Avenue?

8th grade students are selected for WEB based on interest. WEB Leaders are a diverse cross-section of the student body. Students do not have to be "A" students to be WEB Leaders.

WEB Leaders train two full days prior to the WEB
Orientation Day. WEB Orientation Day or "WEB DAY" is
the Friday before school starts.

All incoming 7th grade students are divided into groups of 10 or less.

2-3 WEB Leaders are assigned to each group of students forming a WEB group.

Oak Avenue currently has 42 WEB groups.

There are various follow-up activities throughout the year.
