Fairview Speech & Debate Team Celebrates Nationals and Kicks-Off New Season

The Fairview Speech & Debate team is excited to kick-off its 2023 - 2024 competitive season this fall, especially celebrating the wins and achievements of last year's team. Over the summer 15 students represented Fairview and the Rocky Mountain North Speech and Debate district at the National Speech and Debate Association National Tournament held in Phoenix, AZ. Nine students advanced to elimination rounds, with Carder Squirrell (Sophomore, '25) making it to Octafinals in Extemporaneous Commentary, Una Basta (Senior, '23) placing 12th in Lincoln Douglas Debate and Kylie Berg (Junior, '24) placing 9th in Extemporaneous Debate.

The Fairview Speech & Debate team is one of the most competitive programs in the state and team members are committed to building a true community for students at Fairview. The team has multiple state champions and is highly competitive nationally. New students wishing to join the team should attend meetings from 4 - 6pm in 660 on Thursdays. 

Interested in becoming a teacher or school counselor? Want to get **two years of free college tuition, books and fees**? If so, apply to <u>TREP</u> (Teacher Recruitment and Education Program)!

To qualify for TREP, you have to take <u>one of these college level courses</u> while still in high school and fill out an application by March 30th of your senior year. Once accepted, you'll receive two free years of tuition, books and fees at Metro State University, Front Range Community College or Colorado State University at Pueblo.

'One Chip Challenge' awareness and risk



The BVSD Health Services team has asked us to share that nationally, the recent <u>Paqui</u> <u>"One Chip Challenge"</u> has resulted in many young people requiring emergency care. BVSD has recently had to send multiple students home from schools due to adverse effects of eating this product.

The challenge involves eating an extremely spicy chip and then waiting as long as possible after consuming the chip before eating or drinking to relieve the burning - and some share videos of the challenge on social media. On September 6th, the New York Times reported a 14-year-old boy died hours after consuming the product. The next day, The Washington Post reported the company announced they were pulling the product from stores.

Please consider talking to your student about this product/challenge and the serious side-effects that may occur with its use or similar products. Contact your school nurse with any questions.

Conciencia y riesgo del reto One Chip Challenge

El equipo de Servicios de Salud del BVSD nos ha pedido que compartamos a nivel nacional que el reciente reto <u>One Chip Challenge</u> de Paqui ha provocado que muchos jóvenes necesiten atención médica urgente. El BVSD recientemente tuvo que enviar a varios estudiantes a casa debido a los efectos adversos del consumo de este producto.

El reto consiste en comer un chip extremadamente picante y luego esperar el mayor tiempo posible después de consumirlo antes de comer o beber para aliviar el ardor, y algunos comparten videos del desafío en las redes sociales. El 6 de septiembre, el *New York Times* informó que un niño de 14 años murió horas después de consumir el producto. Al día siguiente, *The Washington Post* informó que la compañía había anunciado que retirarían el producto de las tiendas.

Considere hablar con su estudiante sobre este producto/reto y los graves efectos secundarios que pueden ocurrir con su consumo o el de productos similares. Comuníquese con la enfermera de su escuela si tiene alguna pregunta.
