

Dear Bellevue Union School District Families and Staff,

We just finished the 21st day of school which means that more than 10% of the school year is complete. It is remarkable to think of the school year in those terms as it still feels like the beginning of the year. With that in mind, we are reminded how important it is for our students to attend school regularly. The month of September is Attendance Awareness Month. During this month, we are reminding families about the importance of consistent attendance. To further support improving student attendance rates, we hired a District Family Engagement Facilitator who will be working with families who have been identified as chronically absent. Additionally, we contracted with a retired school administrator who will be overseeing student attendance throughout the district. We are hopeful that these efforts will support improved student attendance district-wide.

State of the District

- LCAP Advisory Committee: We are currently recruiting members of our community to serve on the LCAP Advisory Committee. The purpose of this committee is to provide support and guidance in the development of our new LCAP. We are hoping to recruit a representative body of staff and parents who can help us in the creation of our BUSD Roadmap to the Future. Please email: superintendent@busd.org if you are interested in joining the committee. Our first meeting will be held on September 21st at the District Office.
- Safe Routes to School: The Bellevue Union School District is committed to working with the City of Santa Rosa to identify opportunities for our students to get to and from school safely. Additionally, we will be working with the Safe Routes to School Task Force to encourage families to safely walk or bike to school. On September 28th at 10:30 am, we will be hosting a task force meeting at the BUSD District Office. We will be extending an invitation to our families to attend if they would like to hear more about what is being planned by the City of Santa Rosa and provide them with the opportunity to share what they see as community needs related to walking or biking to school.
- Enrollment: Enrollment in the district continues to trend upwards. We are closely watching class and grade level capacities, and we will be ready to open new sections throughout the school year should the need arise. With increased enrollment we continue to hire new staff to provide the support necessary for our schools to operate successfully, and we are continuing to invest in our employees by providing a significant amount of training to all employees as we continue to find ways to allow our people to grow and enjoy success in their work.

In closing, I would like to publicly thank our principals and site leaders for their outstanding work. I am inspired by their commitment to ensuring their schools are functioning at the highest of levels in spite of the myriad of challenges that they must tackle each and every day. With the Week of the School Administrator scheduled for October 8-14, I ask that our community joins me in taking time to appreciate and thank our site administrators.

Budget and Financial Update:

On September 12th, the District presented a comprehensive overview and analysis of its unaudited, actual financial activity for the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2023. This report reflected the District's commitment to scrutinize and refine its budget, thereby facilitating informed fiscal recommendations to the Board of Trustees. This financial report - which is posted on the District's website - should be considered in conjunction with the District's Fiscal Year 2023-24 Budget, which was submitted to the Board of Trustees on August 15, 2023. The Unaudited Actuals report serves as a vital tool for understanding how the District concluded the preceding fiscal year. It also provides a historical perspective by pointing to data back to FY 2017/18. The report begins with an examination of enrollment and funded Average Daily Attendance (ADA) figures, proceeds to delineate crucial revenue and expenditure components, identifies the components of the District's ending fund balance (reserves), an analysis of the District's Special Education program and programs funded through one-time sources, and offers insights into various programmatic funds, such as Child Development, Child Nutrition, and Facilities Funds.

Citizen's Bond Oversight Committee:

The specific bond for which we are petitioning your service is related to the District's Measure C Bond which was passed by voters in April 2020. The District is currently seeking members who meet the following criteria:

- 1 member shall be active in a bona fide taxpayers' organization
- 1 member shall be the parent or guardian of a child enrolled in the district

At BUSD we have great learning opportunities and resources for our students and our families. All students have access to the following learning tools through Clever:

Lalilo (K-2):

It is an online learning platform that will help your students learn foundational reading skills in:

- Phonics (Letter-sound Correspondence)
- Phonological awareness
- Sight words
- Word families
- Independent reading
- Listening comprehension
- Grammar and conventions

Recommended Usage Time: 15-20 minutes daily

Students can access Lalilo from home for free using an iPad or computer.

Freckle Math and Freckle Language Arts (K-6):

Freckle Math and Language Arts is an online learning platform that allows students to practice Math and Language Arts at their own level in either English or Spanish. Freckle continuously adapts to each student's individual skills so each student is getting the appropriate challenge, whether they're working at, above, or below grade level.

Recommended Usage Time: 15-20 minutes daily per content area (15-20 minutes for Language Arts and 15-20 minutes for Math)

Students can access Freckle from home for free using an iPad or computer.

Imagine Español (TK-2) - for Kawana Springs Students Only

Imagine Español is a personalized learning solution that accelerates grade-level reading and language proficiency in Spanish for students in grades TK–2. Designed to address the diverse instructional needs of native speakers and students learning to read in Spanish. Imagine Español teaches foundational literacy skills in an engaging, game-like environment that celebrates the cultures of the Spanish-speaking world. Recommended Usage Time: 15-20 minutes daily

Students can access Imagine Español from home for free using an iPad or computer.

Reflex Math (2-6)

Reflex Math is math practice that makes it easy to get students math fact fluent and ready for more complex math. Assessment, coaching, and practice are delivered via a fun, game-based approach. And because it is fully adaptive, students get the individualized instruction they need to be successful. Recommended Usage Time: 15-20 minutes daily Students can access Reflex Math from home for free using an iPad or computer

Accelerated Reader (1-6)

Accelerated Reader is a digital program that helps students and teachers manage and monitor independent reading practice in both English and Spanish. "Just reading" transforms into high-quality reading practice that fuels growth: Reading quizzes monitor comprehension, while literacy skills and vocabulary quizzes extend student learning and build skills mastery. Recommended Usage Time: 35 minutes per day Students can access Accelerated Reader from home using an iPad or computer



Our social emotional curriculum, CharacterStrong, continues in its second year of implementation. This year included a Kindness Kickoff when students first returned to school. The focus for September is RESPECT! *Respect is seeing value in all people and things & treating them with care.* Each week teachers lead a lesson on respect as students develop a deeper understanding of what it means and its impact.

CharacterStrong Tier II curriculum has been added for our school counselors to use with small groups of students who require additional intervention and support in regulating their emotions, relationships, self-management, and coping skills.

What is ACP? The Affordable Connectivity Program is a Federal Communications Commission effort to help

families and households struggling to afford internet service. It provides:

- Up to a \$30 monthly discount on internet services for eligible households.
- Up to a \$75 monthly discount on internet services for households living on qualifying tribal lands.
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet purchased through a participating provider. The one-time discount requires a consumer co-payment of more than \$10 and less than \$50.

The ACP is available to any household with a member enrolled in a federal assistance program including Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Medi-Cal, Women, Infants & Children Program (WIC), and others, or that is low-income.
