What is Title I?

Title I is a federal program under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) as reauthorized by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB). Title I covers the fiscal and program requirements for improving the academic achievement of students who attend schools eligible for Title I. Title I aims to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach, at minimum, proficiency on challenging State academic achievement standards and state academic assessments.

How do schools receive Title I funds?

The New Jersey Department of Education performs calculations based on census and poverty data in the district and each school. Based on federal guidelines, the district must identify all eligible schools using the most current enrollment and poverty data. You can review New Jersey's Title I funding information [here](#).
