Dear PVSD School Board Members,

We the members of the Measure C Citizens' Oversight Committee (COC) respectfully submit the following report to the residents, voters and taxpayers of the Pleasant Valley School District. This report fulfills the requirement of a Proposition 39 bond requiring that the School District Board of Trustees (School Board) form an independent COC, and that this committee report to the public on the proper expenditure of bond funds at least once annually. This report covers expenses in the time frame of July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020.

During this fiscal year, the committee met twice – September 26, 2019 and January 23, 2020. In March 2020 our lives changed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The school district switched to distanced, online learning and a statewide shelter in place order kept us at home. At that time very little was known about COVID-19 so the district limited indoor school site access to reduce virus transmission. This greatly limited the ability to work and bid on Measure C projects. Supply chain disruptions caused delays for projects underway and those planned for summer. The committee was updated with status information via email in April and again in late June. Despite all of these challenges, the district was able to move forward with large scale projects.

Committee members and board members, masked up and socially distanced, visited several project sites in July 2020. During these visits we saw improvements such as outdoor classroom areas and expanded drop off and pickup areas being completed. Those projects as well as the already upgraded HVAC systems would be helpful in having students return to campuses safely.

During FY 19-20 the district completed Measure C projects totaling \$12,087,655. With bond sale fees paid, and interest earned, \$25,702,111 remains from the initial \$40,000,000 Series A sale of Measure C bonds.


At this time, the performance audit for FY19-20 is not complete due to delays caused by COVID restrictions. Normally, the committee would have reviewed the audit as part of the annual report process to ensure Measure C funds have been spent appropriately. When the audit is available, the committee will review that information, publish the audit on the committee webpage and provide an update to the board if needed. Based on the information internally prepared by district staff, the committee reports that the funds have been spent on Measure C projects and the associated resources to administer the projects and bond delivery costs. No funds have been spent on teacher salaries, administrative salaries or operational costs.

The committee appreciates the willingness and effort of the district to provide the committee the support and information needed so we can effectively carry out our responsibility of oversight to the community.

This report was approved by the committee at their Zoom meeting on Thursday, January 28, 2021.
