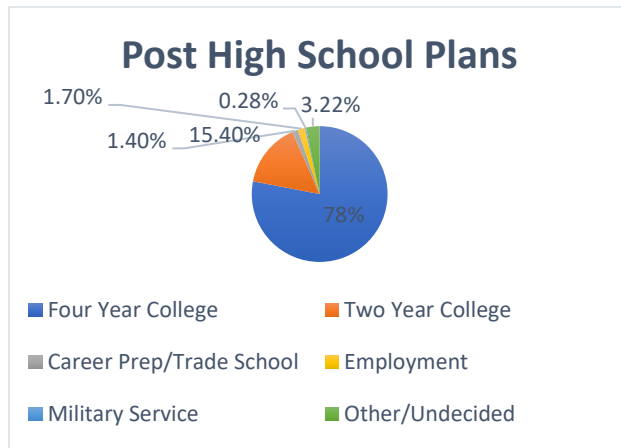
Class Rank

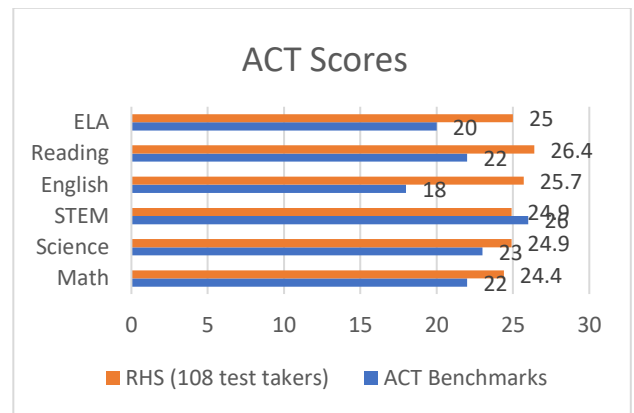
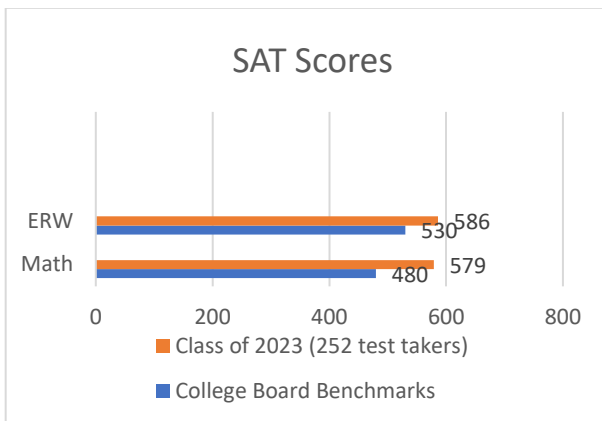

Advanced Placement Exams

Randolph High School is committed to the Advanced Placement Program. Our AP enrollment continues to be robust along with a district passing average approaching 90%. We proudly became an AP Capstone school in the inaugural year of the program. Overall, Randolph High School has awarded over fifty AP Capstone Diplomas to date. In May 2023, 410 Randolph High School students took 871 AP exams. The percentage of students with a score of 3 or higher was 89.27%.
