ONLINE SAFETY PUPIL TALKS

As part of our induction programme during the first two days of term, we were very fortunate to be joined by Boris Radanovic from the UK Safer Internet Centre and the Southwest Grid for Learning, who gave some highly thought-provoking and informative Online Safety presentations to all pupils in Years 1 to 8. Online Safety education is vital for anyone who works with or cares for young people and forms a vital aspect of a school's safeguarding strategy. Recognising, responding and dealing with online issues can be challenging, while legislation and inspections highlight a setting's ability to keep children, teachers and other staff safe online.

Boris spoke about both the positive and negative effects of the internet, gaming and social media and how to keep safe in the virtual world, and with our older pupils talked about the hot topic of artificial intelligence (AI). In this field the positives far outweigh the negatives, but it is hugely important our pupils know how to keep themselves safe, know how to act as responsible digital citizens and know what to do if they come across something or someone who makes them feel threatened or uncomfortable. It was very clear from listening to the children that they enjoy playing games and communicating online. This is absolutely fine, but it is important that they are doing this on platforms that are appropriate to them and designed for their age.

Central to your children staying safe online is that you are part of their digital lives, you know what they are doing online and that you have open and constructive conversations with them around online safety. With this in mind, I thought you might find the links below useful when talking to your children about this subject.

- Colouring pencils or felt tips, rubber, sharpener (we will provide you with a 2B drawing pencil).


Anything else I need to know?


YEAR 3

TENNIS

The LTA have awarded Millfield Prep U10 Performance Programme status again this year, which recognises the commitment in fostering the development of young aspirational tennis players. This means that the LTA National Pathway coaches will continue to work closely with our Prep coaches and this kitemark will provide access to a high level of coach development opportunities, which will continue to raise our standards and allow our players the best opportunity to move through the LTA Player Pathway.

The U12 Boys National Club League team of **Toby W, Zach K, Ollie W** and **Fredi D-H** qualified for the National Club League finals at the National Tennis Centre in Roehampton, coming fourth out of the 5,500 clubs that entered this competition.

Four Millfield Prep players qualified for LTA National Championships in their age groups: **Zach K, Tommy W, Alemendra C G** and **Toby W**. Toby who reached the SF of U12 doubles at the Championships. Zach reached the QF of the U12 doubles in Nottingham, while Toby also reached the U12 doubles quarter final at a Grade 2 event in Scotland.

Ollie W qualified for the 'Play your Way to Wimbledon' National Finals at Wimbledon. Ollie also won four Grade 3 U12 Doubles events (two of which with fellow Prep pupil **Tommy W**) and an U14 Grade 4 Doubles title (also with Tommy beating **Fredi D-H** and **Thomas K** in the final). Ollie was a winner and runner up in two U12 Grade 3 singles events, won a Grade 4 U16 singles and doubles title and was runner-up in the U16 Grade 4 in Cirencester. Tommy won the Grade 3 U12 singles at the Wigan Head Open.

Fredi D-H came third in a Grade 3 event in Sussex and competed in a National level tournament in Spain, where he reached the SF of the U12 singles and QF of the U14 singles.

Arabella G played in the Esher U12 Grade 3 and won the consolation draw.

Both the boys and girls teams are through to the Regional Playoffs of the Year 7 and 8 National Schools Competition, with the boys team due to play away against Bournemouth School on Thursday 28 September.

In the Somerset County Closed Competition, Millfield Prep pupils won the following titles:

Charlotte J-A U8 Girls winner Noah F U8 Boys winner (Finn S runner up) and U9 Boys winner Almendra C G U10 Girls winner (Lowri S runner up) Oscar F U10 Boys winner (Max W runner up) Almendra C G U11 Girls winner (Lowri S runner up) Oscar F U11 Boys winner Toby W U12 Boys winner, U14 Boys runner up, U16 Boys SF and third in U18 Doubles with Thomas K.

Zach K won the U12 Doubles and was runner up in the U14 Doubles and Mixed Doubles in the Hampshire and Isle of Wight County Closed. He also won the East Dorset Grade 3 singles title.

Tommy W won the U12 singles at the Avon County Closed and has been invited to play at the Babolat National Finals later in September. He will be representing Avon in the U12 County Cup competition this weekend. **Toby W, Ollie F** and **Fredi D-H** are representing Somerset in the U12 County Cup, while **Zach K's** county team are already through to the National finals. This year, an incredible 17 Millfield Prep players have represented their respective counties in the County Cup competitions across all the age groups.

Oscar F won the U11 event at Allt-yr-Yn, Newport, while Edward P was the U14 Grade 5 consolation winner at Cheddar.
























HOCKEY

CROSS COUNTRY


