

Research Links Evidence-Based SEL to Positive Outcomes¹




Positive Outcomes

- Improved social-emotional skills
- More positive attitudes about self, others, and school
- Increased prosocial classroom behavior
- Fewer conduct issues
- Less emotional distress
- 11 percentile-point gain in overall academic achievement





Social-Emotional Competencies & Sample Skills⁵








The Power of Holistic SEL

Children benefit most when all adults in their lives, in and out of school, are working together to teach, model, and reinforce SEL.











A School's Role in Supporting Holistic SEL

Explicit SEL Instruction

A comprehensive, universal, research-based classroom curriculum

Schoolwide Practices

- All adults are familiar with common language and strategies
- All adults practice and reinforce skills and strategies with students and with one another throughout the school environment







Our Roles in Supporting SEL Schoolwide

SEL Leadership Team	Lead and support schoolwide implementation planning and logistics			
Lesson Instructors	Teach 20 weekly lessons, in order, one per week (15–30 min. each) Facilitate daily practice activities (5–10 min. each) Reinforce and integrate common language and skills throughout the day			
All Staff	Reinforce common language and skills in all areas of the school
