

MOUNT SAINT DOMINIC ACADEMY 2023-2024 SCHOOL PROFILE

School and Community - Mount Saint Dominic Academy is a private, Catholic, college preparatory school established in 1892 by the Sisters of Saint Dominic of Caldwell. Staff includes the Sisters of Saint Dominic and carefully chosen lay faculty, who are dedicated to the values and missions of the academy. The student population is diverse in ethnic, religious, and economic backgrounds and resides in Essex, Morris, Passaic, Union, Bergen, Sussex, and Hudson Counties.

Mission - The Mount community is committed to seeking the Truth in all aspects of life. The students are able to realize their individual gifts and talents in an atmosphere that fosters academic excellence, respect for diversity, appreciation for the gifts of creation, moral integrity, and a heritage rich in Christ-centered values.

Accreditation – The school is accredited by the Middle States Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges and holds membership in the New Jersey Association of Independent Schools.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Honors and AP Courses - Admission to honors and advanced placement courses are by approval of the Academic Dean. There are 16 Advanced Placement courses offered to juniors and seniors. All students enrolled in an AP course(s) are required to sit for the respective AP Exam(s).

One Schoolhouse - Junior and senior students, who are approved by the academic dean for good academic standing, are invited to take computer science and engineering courses through OS. Students are allotted time during their school schedule to complete assignments and tests and meet regularly with the online coordinator.

Peer Leadership Program - Fourteen senior leaders are trained to guide incoming freshmen in weekly group sessions to discuss time management, social skills and general well-being. The application process is highly competitive and a position on the team is considered one of the highest honors.

Senior Capstone in Directed Research – New course allowing seniors to design, plan, and implement a yearlong investigation to address a research question related to their interests. Students learn research methods; employ ethical research practices; and access, analyze, and synthesize information in preparation for a paper and presentation with oral defense.

The Entrepreneur Program is a two-year intensive, taught by faculty, business experts, and professional entrepreneurs, encompassing the full life cycle of creating a business or product from ideation to launch, with the focus on **Leadership**, **Entrepreneurship**, and **Opportunities**.

The Endorsement programs in Health Sciences and Social Justice, which incorporate a two-year sequence of courses, permit students interested in careers in health sciences and social justice to pursue in-depth explorations of those areas, similar to a major in college.

Admission to Mount Saint Dominic Academy is based on one or more of the following:

- Applicant's Elementary School Record
- Recommendation of Elementary School Principal
- Personal Interviews



GRADING SYSTEM

The grading system is a numerical one with 70 as the lowest passing mark. Grades are distributed four times a year. The calendar is divided into two semesters of approximately 18 weeks with each semester followed by a week of examinations. Semester grades include exam grades. Lab sciences grant 6 credits for the year and all other major courses grant five credits for the year.

Weighting Policy - Students receive an extra 3 points for honors classes and 5 points for AP classes. The weighting is **only** reflected in their GPA, not individual grades.

To Qualify for First Honors - The total weighted average for major courses must be 93 or higher. All grades for courses in the marking period must be 90 or higher, including all exam marks in the second and fourth marking periods.

To Qualify for Second Honors - The total weighted average for major courses must be 90 or higher. All grades for courses in the marking period must be 85 or higher, including all exam marks in the second and fourth marking periods.

RANK - Due to the challenging and competitive nature of the academic curriculum, MSDA does not rank its students.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS FOR THE CLASS OF 2024

Students must earn at least 149 credits in order to graduate. The following subjects are required:
