SCHOOL & COMMUNITY

Located 25 miles west of Philadelphia in Chester County, PA, the Great Valley School District has a population of approximately 36,000. The district encompasses an area of 43.3 square miles and includes Charlestown, East Whiteland and Willistown Townships, plus the borough of Malvern.

Great Valley is a comprehensive public high school with an enrollment of 1,445 students in grades 9 through 12. The professional staff numbers 114 and is fully accredited. Great Valley High School has been recognized by the United States Department of Education for "Excellence in Education." The district maintains academic partnerships that include the Desmond Project, Sports Marketing, and the Danish Exchange Program.

ABILITY GROUPING

Each course number indicates the instructional level at which the course is presented. GVHS instructional levels are: Advanced Placement (AP), Honors (HR), Academic A (AA), and Modified Course (MC).

0 = Honors or AP 2/3 = Academic A 5 = Modified Course

Note: Numbers for courses from other schools or programs do not reflect Great Valley academic levels. Courses labeled with the "TRAN" code have been transferred from another accredited school.

GRADING

Report cards are issued four times during the school year. Grades include: A+ (97-100), A (93-96), A- (90-92), B+ (87-89), B (83-86), B- (80-82), C+ (77-79), C (73-76), C- (70-72), D+ (67-69), D (63-66), D- (60-62), E (less than 60), WF (Withdrawal/Fail), WP (Withdrawal/Pass).

A grade of "S" (Satisfactory) carries credit toward graduation, but is not included in the computation of the grade point average. A grade of "U" (Unsatisfactory) is the equivalent of a failure and is computed in the grade point average. Courses coded with the "TRAN" code are transferred from another accredited school and are also not included in the computation of the grade point average.

CURRICULUM AND ADVANCED PROGRAMS

Great Valley High School offers students an extensive and diverse curriculum featuring a wealth of elective courses. The average class size is 28 students. All Great Valley students are required to successfully complete:

- Four years of English
- Three years of Math, Science and Social Studies
- Two Health courses, six semesters of Physical Education, plus a distribution requirement in humanities and elective areas

Honors and AP courses are designed to offer a greater breadth and depth of learning experiences and are considered to be substantially more difficult than others in the curriculum. In recognition of the high level of achievement expected, grades in these courses are given a weighted factor of .50 for AP and .25 for Honors, in addition to the grade points indicated in the "Letter Grade Conversion Scale" found on page 1. For example, a "B" in an Honors class would receive a quality point value of 3.25 in the GPA calculation, and a "B" in an AP class would receive a quality point value of 3.50 in the GPA calculation.

CONTINUING EDUCATION

For the class of 2023, approximately 91% of Great Valley High School graduates continued in a program of higher education. Approximately 84% enrolled in 4-year colleges and 7% enrolled in 1- and 2-year colleges.

CLASS RANK

Class rank is not included on report cards or transcripts. Great Valley School District will provide colleges with a detailed grade distribution.

When requested by a student, parent, or college, class rank will be reported in deciles. If a student falls in the top 5%, that fact (rather than top 10%) will be reported, and counselors will emphasize the high academic achievement of those with a 4.0 GPA or above in their recommendations.
