COMMUNITY PROFILE

The Borough of Sayreville, the home of Sayreville War Memorial High School, is a suburban community located in Middlesex County, 25 miles south of New York City and seven miles east of New Brunswick. Because of its proximity to the New York Metropolitan area, the population has grown from 10,000 in 1950 to approximately 45,000 in 2020. To accommodate the school-age population, there are four public elementary schools, one upper elementary and one middle school, in addition to the high school. Sayreville is the home of such nationally known industries as Ameristeel Corporation, Ashland Inc., Commercial Metals Company, E.I. DuPont de Nemours & Company, Green Tree Chemical Technologies, Sabert Corporation, and Sysco Guest Supply, Inc.

SCHOOL PROFILE

Sayreville War Memorial High School includes grades 9-12. It has a 2023-2024 enrollment of 1765. The class of 2023 graduated 400 students.

Sayreville War Memorial High School has an extensive array of curricular offerings (on the standard, honors and advanced placement levels) designed to meet specific needs and interests of students. Special classes are available for remediation as well as for students with learning disabilities.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

130 credits (grades 9-12) which include the following: 20 credits of English, 10 credits of US History, 5 credits of World History, 20 credits of Physical Education and Health (or one credit year for each year of enrollment), 15 credits of Mathematics, 15 credits of Science, 5 credits of World Language, 2.5 credits of Financial Literacy in the 21st Century, 5 credits of Fine or Performing Arts and 5 credits of Practical Arts.
