


98,000 undocumented students graduate high school every year




# IMMIGRATION STATUS ELEGIBIILITY



## In order to be eligible, you must have one of the following

- U-visa
- T-visa
- Temporary Protected Status (TPS)
- Deferred Enforced Departure (DED)
- Deferred Action Against Childhood Arrivals (DACA)
- Undocumented (without lawful status)


## EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS



## In order to be eligible, you must either

- Attended a New York State high school for at least two years and have received an NYS high school diploma and enrolled in a SUNY/CUNY within 5 years of graduating
- OR, Attend an undergraduate program within 5 years of receiving a NYS high school equivalency diploma (TASC/GED)
- OR, Attend a graduate program within ten years of receiving an NYS high school diploma
- OR, Qualify for in-state tuition





### APPLICATION TIPS



 If a student is undocumented or their parents are undocumented, they should remove the street address and any parent names visible on the documentation  Students will receive emails from two (2) possible ISTS email addresses. Both should be added to the contacts so that they don't go to spam

## TUTITION ASSITANCE PROGRAM



TAP is a 4-year grant, meaning students do not pay this money back.
Students must reapply every year to receive the funds and accept the offer on their portal.

Eligible students can receive up to \$5,165. The award amount depends on the income of the student and/or the income of their guardians.

There are different income ceilings for students to deem if they are eligible

#### **TAP Application FAQ** \* indicates a required field. **Tuition Assistance Program Details** You are applying for the New York State Tuition Assistance Program (TAP). TAP provides up to \$5,165 in annual tuition support to recipients attending an approved college in New York State. Your annual award will depend on factors including your family's household income, the number of family members attending college full-time, and the number of terms you have received the award. The good news is because TAP is a grant, it does not have to be paid back. ## INCOME CEILINGS



\$80,000 for dependent undergraduate students or independent students who are married and have tax dependents, or independent students who are unmarried and have tax dependents

\$40,000 for married independent undergraduate students who have no other tax dependents

\$10,000 for unmarried independent undergraduate students with no tax dependents

## "Do I or my family need to pay taxes to qualify for TAP?"



The question(s) below are to determine which of the family members who reside in your household are or will attend college in the upcoming academic year. This information is used to help determine your award amount.

If you are financially dependent on a parent, other family members in college include parents, spouse, siblings, and children. If you are financially independent, other family members in college can only include your spouse and your dependent children.

# INFORMATION NEEDED FOR TAP

The TAP application requires students to provide the name of the college they are attending and their college ID

If the student filed their taxes as an independent, they will need their:

- ITIN/SNN
- Household income

If the students family filed their taxes and claimed the student as a dependent, they will need

- their parents ITIN/SNN
- The status and state in which they filed for taxes

If you transfer schools, be sure to email NYSDREAM@apply.ist so your funds can be internally moved and processed

Be sure to apply every year once the application becomes available.

If you take time off from school, be sure to complete a Leave of Absence so your scholarship is paused



### EXCELSIOR



Excelsior is a 4-year scholarship program. The student must reapply every year to receive the funds and accept the offer.

Under contract with HESC, the Excelsior application requires students to agree to work and live in NYS for the length and time they received the award If the student were to break the contract, they would have to pay back the funds

The students college will communicate their award amount to them directly

#### **Excelsior Scholarship Details**

You are applying for the Excelsior Spring 2020 Scholarship. This application is for students looking to receive a first-time Excelsior award for the spring 2020 term. The New York State Excelsior Scholar eligible students from families who earn up to \$125,000 a year to attend a SUNY or CUNY college tuition free. Recipients receive award payments for up to two years of continuous full-time study in associate's degree or four years of continuous full-time study leading to a bachelor's degree, or five years if the program of study normally requires five years. Don't forget, if you accept the award, yo hours towards your program of study each year and agree to live and work, if employed, in New York State for the length of time you received the award. Failure to meet these requirements will resu award to a no-interest loan. Please note, if you are already a recipient of an Excelsior Scholarship from a previous application period, you do not need to complete this application. You are a recipient the Excelsior Scholarship contract, even if you did not receive payment in the prior term.
