Objective



- ◆ To provide an overview of graduation requirements, college admissions requirements and the college application process.

- ◆ To help students prepare for a successful senior year and to explore post-secondary options.





Graduation Requirements for the Class of 2024

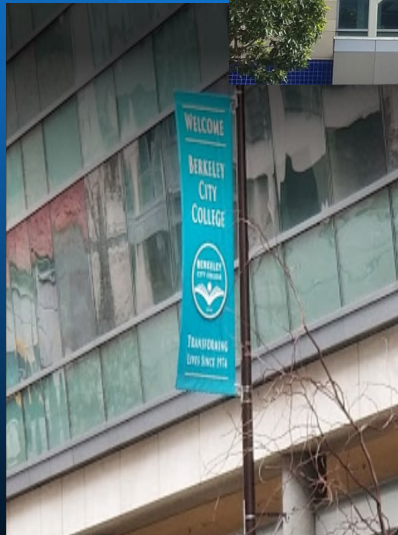
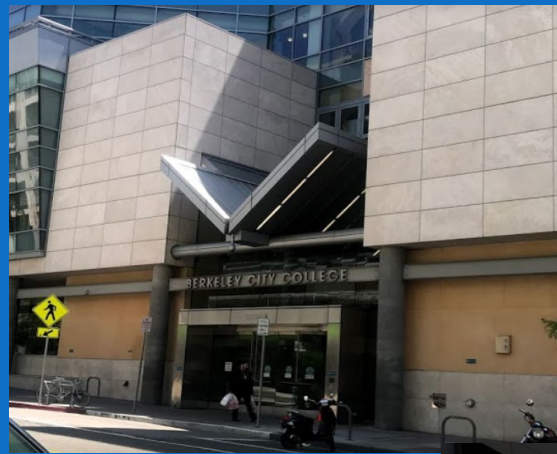
Post secondary plans

- Community college (e.g. COA, BCC, etc.) options:
 - Transfer to a 4-year college
 - Complete an Associates degree in a Vocational program to prepare for the work world.
- 4-year college (e.g., UC's, CSU's, HBCU's, etc.)
- Military (e.g., Coast Guard, Air Force, Army, etc.)
- Apprenticeship programs (e.g. electricians, plumbing, carpentry, construction, etc.)
- Employment

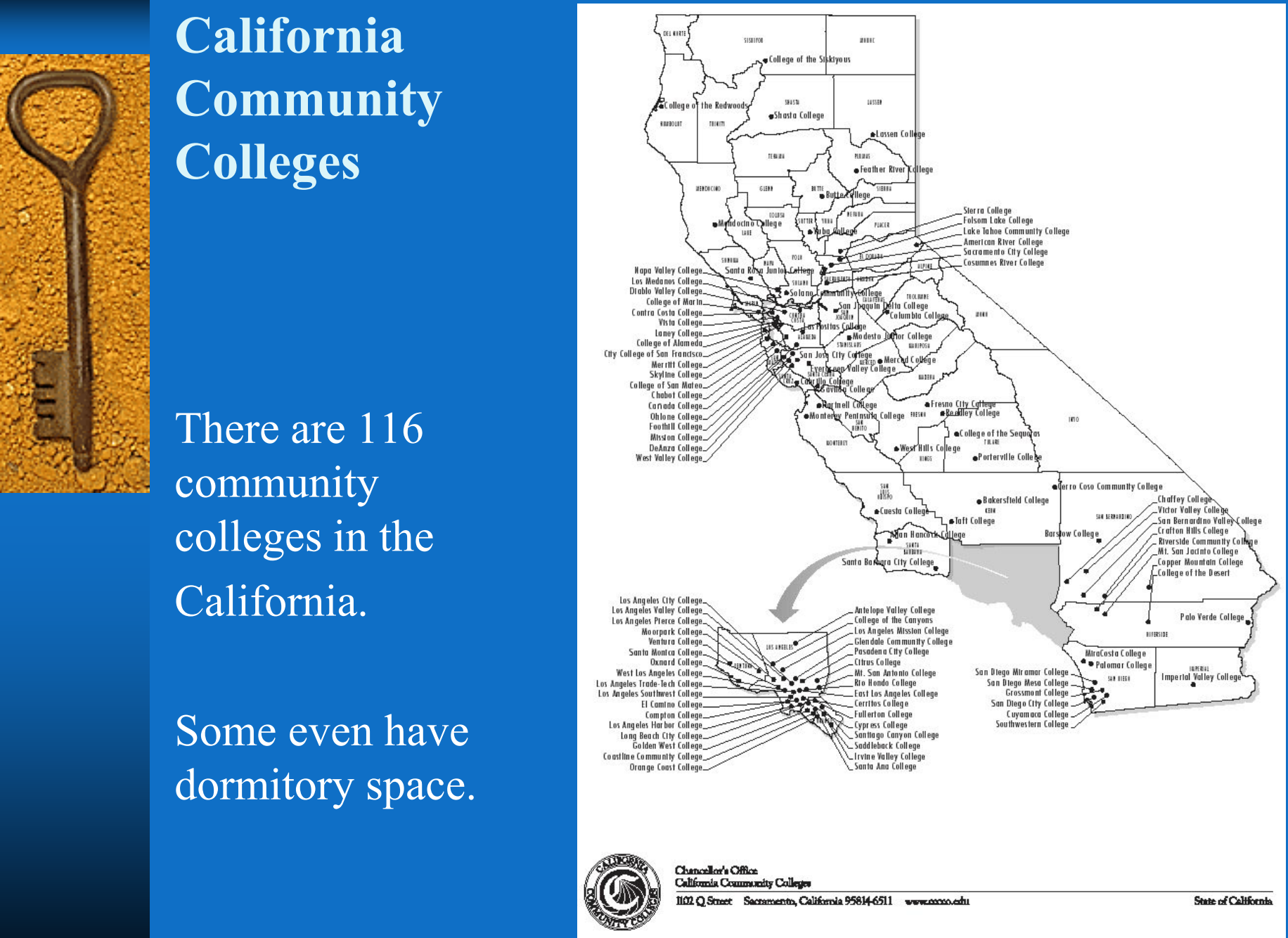


What factors are colleges looking at to determine freshman admission?

- ◆ High School Graduation
- ◆ Completion of certain classes (A-G requirements)
- ◆ GPA
- ◆ Test Scores—many schools are test blind or test optional now.
- ◆ Other—personal statements, activities, secondary school reports, letters of recommendation, auditions, portfolios, etc.

- ◆ After applying, students will meet with a college counselor to plan their educational program. Students may need to take tests in English or math or provide a high school transcript for placement.

What are CSUs looking for?

High School Graduation	Yes
A-G Completion	Yes
Minimum GPA(gr 10-12) in A-G classes	2.5** (see next slide for more info)
SAT/ACT Requirement	Not required. If you provide scores, they will be used for placement purposes only.
Other Requirements	Application questions will ask about activities, work experience, leadership, etc.



New Admissions Policy



- ◆ Since CSU is test blind (SAT/ACT will not be considered for admissions), they have changed the way they will evaluate applications.
- ◆ Minimum Qualifying A- G GPA = 2.5 (“minimally eligible”) Students will be evaluated for admission.
- ◆ Campuses can choose to evaluate students with A-G GPA between 2.0 - 2.49.



Supplemental Factors



- ◆ CSUs may also look at supplemental factors. They could include **academic factors** such as total number of A-G's or specific subject GPA and **non-academic factors** such as work experience, activities, and leadership.
- ◆ Each campus will determine which factors they will consider.
- ◆ “Supporting Information” application section will address non-academic factors.

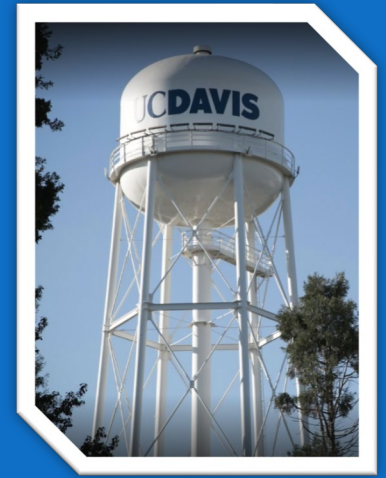

Advice from the UC



- ◆ Be realistic in your choices
 - Use the tools in SCOIR to compare your GPA and tests scores to students who have been admitted from AHS.
 - Check the various school websites for the number ranges of admitted students
- ◆ Take time with your Personal Insight Questions
- ◆ Provide Context and Details



Impaction at the UC Campuses

- ◆ All UC campuses are selective in terms of admissions. It is all a matter of degrees.
- ◆ UC Merced is the only campus which is not impacted and will accept all eligible applicants.





UC Personal Insight Questions

- ◆ There are 8 questions total. You choose 4 out of 8 to answer.
- ◆ You decide which questions to answer— all have equal weight.
- ◆ Maximum word limit of 350 per question.
- ◆ This is an opportunity to let the admissions committee know about you as a person.
- ◆ Write about your growth and learning experiences.
- ◆ Use extra comments box to explain any discrepancies and to provide additional information.

Additional Comment Boxes

- ◆ Two areas available— one after Academic section, one after PIQs.
- ◆ Limited space. Full sentences are not expected.
- ◆ Academic comment box allows 500 characters. Use it to explain things like grade discrepancies, scheduling limitations, etc.
- ◆ Additional Comment Box after PIQs allows for 550 words. This is NOT space for an additional PIQ but use it to explain something or to provide more information about something that may not have fit in your PIQs.

Common Application



- ◆ Utilized by many private and out of state colleges & universities including many HBCUs
- ◆ Requires 2 Teacher Recommendations & Counselor Recommendation/Report [Secondary School Report (SSR)]
- ◆ Website: www.commonapp.org



Historically Black Colleges & Universities (HBCU)

- ◆ Common Black College Application- one application fee to apply to all 58 member colleges <https://commonblackcollegeapp.com/>
- ◆ California Community Colleges HBCU Transfer Guarantee Program- a guaranteed admissions agreement between the community colleges and HBCUs <https://ccctransfer.org/hbcu/>

Secondary School Reports & Letters of Recommendation

- ◆ Required by private schools and/or all schools which use the Common App.
- ◆ You must complete AHS Student Profile packet (all parts)-available online in the Counseling Section.
- ◆ Deadline to submit packet: **October 1** by **3:45 pm**
- ◆ Counselors and teachers are unavailable during fall/winter breaks to work on SSR/letters.
- ◆ Your counselor may contact you to review your packet if needed.
- ◆ **CSUs and UCs do NOT require Secondary School Reports or letters of recommendation.**



Application Deadlines

- ◆ November 30th for UC
- ◆ November 30th for CSU
- ◆ December /January for Private Universities
- ◆ For Out of State Colleges see school website for deadlines
- ◆ Early Decision & Early Action: Nov 1st
 - Early Decision is Binding
 - Early Action is NOT Binding



College Admissions Testing (SAT/ACT)

- ◆ SAT/ACT are not required by the UC or CSU systems. Even if you provide tests scores they will not consider them in the admissions process.
- ◆ Other colleges/universities have their own Test Policies. You need to check the requirements for all schools to which you plan to apply.
- ◆ If you do want to take the SAT or ACT:
 - ❖ Last SAT/ACT seniors can take are in December
 - ❖ SAT with Writing is no longer available
 - ❖ SAT Subject Tests are no longer available



Sending SAT or ACT Scores

- ◆ If you tested and if you want to send your scores, here is some information to know:
 - Official Scores must be sent from the **College Board or ACT websites**.
 - Send CSU scores to CalStateApply code 3594 for SAT or to any CSU campus— all campuses will have access to those scores.
 - Send UC scores to one campus— all campuses will have access to those scores.



How Many Schools Should I Apply to?

- ◆ It's a good idea to apply to at least 6-8.
- ◆ Shoot for your dream school, but also have a list of several safe schools that you feel reasonably sure will accept you.
- ◆ Make sure you have a “backup” school.
- ◆ Consider application costs (Approx. \$70 per application)
- ◆ Apply for application fee waivers if you think you qualify



Things to remember

- ◆ Use an email account that you will check regularly and consider linking it to your phone. It should NOT be your school email. Colleges will continue to communicate with you during the summer when you may no longer have access to your school account. Check your spam email.
- ◆ Have your transcript in front of you when entering your classes and grades.
- ◆ Make sure you have read the application instructions or taken advantage of any built-in help features especially if you have special circumstances. Ask for help if you need it!
- ◆ Before you submit your college applications make sure you double check all items. Once you submit, you cannot retrieve it.
- ◆ Deadlines matter. Don't wait until the last day.



After the application is submitted

- ◆ Check your e-mail accounts daily, including your school email.
- ◆ Respond to campus requests in a timely manner.
- ◆ Set up and check your admission portals
 - this is the primary way for colleges to communicate with you with regards to missing documents, orientation, etc.
- ◆ Deadlines are still important!



Financial Aid For College

- ◆ **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or California Dream Act Application (CADAA):**
 - “New” FAFSA/CADAA will be available starting ~ **January 1st-April 2nd**
 - Must be completed by ALL seniors
 - Application will screen student eligibility for **loans, grants, and work study**
 - Application available online at: www.fafsa.ed.gov or www.caldreamact.org
- ◆ **Cal Grants:** GPA Verification submitted electronically by AHS for all seniors. You must complete FAFSA or CADAA by **April 2** to qualify.



CSS Profile

(College Scholarship Service Profile)

- ◆ Is a financial aid application utilized by Private Colleges.
- ◆ Is only available through the CollegeBoard website & costs \$25.
- ◆ Available October 1.
- ◆ UC's & CSU's do not require the Profile.




SCAIR
