FLAG FOOTBALL


The winner of Tuesday's (9/19) Central California Conference Girls Flag football game between Merced and Livingston will go a long way in determining what team has the inside track to a CCC championship. Before Tuesday's game Merced, Atwater and Livingston were all undefeated in CCC play. A CCC Championship in the inaugural season of Girls' Flag Football would be a feather in the school's cap heading into the SJS playoffs. Coming into the game the Pack had an overall record of 10-7, winning 7 of their last 8 games with the one loss coming against the Bears on 8/31. In the game on 8/31, a failed 2-point conversion from the Wolves at the end of regulation was the deciding play. On Tuesday night at Merced, the Pack jumped out to an early 6-0 lead midway through the 1st half before Merced responded with their own score and 2-point conversion. Merced led 8-6 at the half. Livingston took the lead and converted their own 2-point conversion at the 8minute mark in the second half when quarterback Elizabeth Avila connected with Olivia Costa. The teams traded possessions before Livingston was forced to punt with just over 2 minutes left in the game. MHS QB Ariana Felix connected with Liliy Meneley in the back of the end zone with under a minute to go in regulation to even the score 14-14. LHS rusher June Cuellar had a game-saving quarterback sack on the Bear's 2-point conversion to nix the go-ahead conversion try leaving the score tied at 14-14 at the end of regulation. In the overtime period, the Bears scored on a hitch & pitch play on their first possession to take a 21-14 lead. The Bear defense would hold the Pack on 4th down as Bear defensive back Averi Steverson made a game saving interception at the goal line. Final score Bears 21, Wolves 14.
