## SCHEDULING

THS operates on a six-period day. Semester classes are 18 weeks long and yearlong classes are 36 weeks. Students are limited to six classes per semester, with exceptions made for students in programs. Students in these programs may add an additional class.

## DUAL ENROLLMENT

THS is centrally located near multiple community colleges. Some students augment their course loads with transferable college courses. Under an agreement with Irvine Valley College, students can dual-enroll to complete Dance 77, Human Development (PSYC 7), Criminal Law (AJ 4), and Sign Language 21 and 22, while on the THS campus, earning both high school and college credit.

## RANKING

In Accordance with Tustin Unified School Board policies, Tustin High School does not rank students.

Tustin will provide percentile range rankings when requested by universities and scholarship organizations.

## GRADING

Tustin High School utilizes a weighted four-point system to calculate students' GPAs.

Grade Scale: 4.0=A+/A/A- 3.0=B+/B/B- 2.0=C+/C/C- 1.0=D+/D/D-

Advanced Placement/Honors courses are weighted

Grade Scale: 5.0=A+/A/A- 4.0=B+/B/B- 3.0=C+/C/C- 2.0=D+/D/D-

Students with international records will receive a "P" Pass or "F" Fail grade on their Tustin High School transcript for courses taken outside the United States. Students are encouraged to provide a copy of their original international records directly to colleges and universities for grade interpretation as warranted.

## \*2020-2021 school year GRADING

Due to the coronavirus pandemic, Tustin Unified School District adopted a Credit/Incomplete Grading Policy for the 2020-2021 school year. A "CR" for Credit indicates that the student fulfilled course requirements satisfactorily. An "I" for Incomplete indicates that the student was not able to complete the course. Only students who submitted a petition for a letter grade during this time received traditional letter grades on their transcript.

### GRADUATION DATA

Tustin High School is proud of its 96.1% graduation rate among Seniors.

### MATRICULATION

Of the 75% of seniors choosing to attend college, 33% of our graduates elected to attend a 4-year university, while 67% chose to attend community college or technical school.

THS offers the INSPIRE Newcomer Program providing Newcomer students with a culturally responsive learning environment focusing on accelerated language acquisition and academic skills necessary for educational success. (A Newcomer is a student who has been enrolled in school in the US for less than 12 months and is a Level 1 on the ELPAC.)

### SEAL OF BILITERACY

21% of graduating Seniors at Tustin High demonstrate proficiency in English and in one or more languages, preparing them to become global citizens in a multicultural and multilingual world.

### HONORS AND ADVANCED PLACEMENT CLASSES

Although grades and teacher recommendations are utilized for primary placement, students have the option to request enrollment in Honors or AP courses.

## SPECIAL PROGRAMS

### Model United Nations

Model United Nations is a hallmark program at Tustin High School. Beginning as a campus club with only twenty students, Model United Nations is now embedded in the History Social Science Department as a UC approved elective course program. Model United Nations students compete at conferences around the world. Tustin High MUN'ers are frequently awarded gavels, which are the conferences' highest recognition and outstanding delegate awards.

### AVID

Tustin High School is an AVID National Demonstration School signifying that we are an exemplary model of the AVID College Readiness System. AVID is a rigorous academic elective for grades 9-12 focused on writing, inquiry, collaboration, organization, and reading as methodologies to accelerate student progress. Throughout the school year, students attend college field trips, participate in tutorial groups with college mentors, and participate in activities to prepare them for their college experience.

### CTE PATHWAYS

Career Technical Education pathways are elective course sequences where students progress in a technical skill earning a cord at graduation for pathway completion. CTE Pathways include Bio Medical Technology, Engineering, Software Engineering, Graphic Design, Visual Imagery, Media Arts, and Robotics.
