- Younger than 22 years old
- Have not earned a high school diploma, or equivalent
- Child(ren) or Spouse of a migratory agricultural worker, or is a migratory agricultural worker himself or herself
- Moved across school district lines within the last 36 months due to temporary or seasonal agricultural employment
