# **Graduation Honors**



**Valedictorian and Salutatorian** 

1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> ranked student according to <u>final</u> class rank using the SC UGP GPA.

**Per SDOC Board Policy**: To be eligible for Valedictorian or Salutatorian, a student must be completing the fourth year of high school and have been enrolled for the last seven consecutive quarters (beginning of the second quarter of grade 11 through the fourth quarter of grade 12).



# **Honor Graduates**



Based on cumulative SC UGP GPA at the end of 7 semesters or 8 semesters

- High Honor Graduate: GPA at least 4.75
   Gold cord designates High Honor Graduate
- ★ Honor Graduate: GPA 4.25 4.74

Blue cord designates Honor Graduate



## **Seneca Rotary Scholars**



- ★ The Seneca Rotary Club recognizes the top 5 students in each grade level (6-12) at a Rotary Scholars Banquet each year.
- The award is based on S.C. UGP GPA for the <u>first three quarters</u> of the current year only – it is NOT based on the cumulative GPA as reported on transcripts.
- Monetary awards ranging from \$100 to \$1500 will be given to seniors at the spring Rotary Banquet. If your child has been recognized as a Rotary Scholar at any time during middle school or high school, your child should attend the Rotary Banquet to receive his or her award.



### Attendance



- ★ Students with more than 5 unlawful absences in a full credit course or more than 3 unlawful absences in a half credit course are at risk of failing due to attendance (FA).
- ★ Lawful absences: Parent Notes (only 3 allowed per semester), Medical Notes, Bereavement, Court Appearances, Field Trips (including Athletics/HCTC/College Visits), Principal Approved Absences (for once-in-a-lifetime, educational trips as approved by Mr. Hudson). Notes must be submitted within three days of an absence.
- ★ Seniors may exempt exams if they have 5 or fewer absences (of any kind) in a full credit course or 3 or fewer absences (of any kind) in a half credit course. Only Field Trips do not count toward this number.

Documentation of absences is required and must be submitted within three days of an absence.





# Early Dismissal / Late Arrival

- ★ Early Dismissal / Late Arrival is a privilege
- Students are not allowed on campus during ED/LA without a written pass from a teacher
- ★ ED/LA is subject to revocation due to poor grades, poor attendance, poor behavior, cutting class, etc.

# **Senior Info**



- Senior CAT visits were conducted on September 6th and 13th.
   Seniors received updated transcripts at that time.
- ★ Counselors have verified credits for graduation. Students should double-check their transcripts for errors and make sure they are not missing any courses or credits required for graduation. If there are concerns, students should discuss with the counselor during the IGP.
- ★ The list of graduation requirements is available in Guidance and on the state's website.



# **College Applications**



Students planning to attend 4-year colleges are encouraged to apply to at least 2 – 3 schools.

Most 4-year colleges consider the following factors during the admissions process:

- Class standing (rank)
- High School GPA
- High school curriculum
- Standardized Test Scores (SAT or ACT)
- Extracurricular activities and community service
- Choice of major



# **College Applications**



We recommend that students create a spreadsheet listing important deadlines and the documents needed for each college application. Keep dates in your phone and mark on a calendar.

#### **COUNSELOR RECOMMENDATION FORMS:**

Students should email required counselor forms to their counselor if possible or drop off a hard copy in Guidance. Allow at least a week for these to be completed.

#### **LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION:**

Students should ask teachers for letters of recommendation at least 3 weeks in advance. Present them with your resume, and follow up with a thank you (note, email, etc.)



# **College Applications**



**TRANSCRIPTS:** After completing online college applications, students may need an official transcript sent from the SHS Guidance Department. Students should submit a transcript request via Parchment. The link to Parchment is on the Seneca High Guidance website under "Transcript Requests."

TEST SCORES: Many colleges allow students to self-report their scores, but some request that official test scores be sent directly from the testing agency to the college.

★ SHS cannot mail, email, or fax official ACT, SAT, or ACCUPLACER scores to colleges. Visit the appropriate site for assistance.



## **Making College Visits**



- ★ It's best to visit on days when events are planned or contact the institutions ahead of time to set up visits.
- ★ Seniors are allowed three excused school day visits.
- ★ Students must complete the College Visitation Form PRIOR to the visit. School day visits are not allowed in Anderson, Pickens or Greenville counties unless students are participating in a formal tour or special program. The visitation form is available in Guidance.

Documentation on official college letterhead must be returned to SHS Attendance after the visit or the absence will be coded as unexcused.

# **Scholarships**

- ★ VERY IMPORTANT Report all scholarship offers to SHS Guidance whether or not the student plans to accept them. Keep up with these; you will be asked for these offers.
- ★ Recent SHS scholarship totals:

### **FAFSA**



### (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

Necessary for need-based scholarships, grants, student loans, work-study, etc.

- ★ FSA IDs are required for parents AND students "Better FAFSA" opens in December 2023
- ★ Use "prior prior" tax info (for college financial aid starting in the fall of 2024, based on information from your 2022 tax return)
- ★ You must complete the FAFSA prior to each college school year



### **Better FAFSA** (<u>Free</u> Application for Federal Student Aid)



- ★ Come to SDOC's FAFSA Help Session when held -DATE: TBD at HCTC (445 Oconee Business Parkway)
- ★ Tri-County Technical College will offer (once open) FAFSA Friday, every Friday, from 10am to 1pm in Ruby Hicks room 211 on the Pendleton campus. (No appointment is necessary). They are willing to help everyone—even those who do not plan to go to Tri-County Tech.



#### **Better FAFSA - do this NOW**

#### **Create an FSA ID** - the Student and Parent need a separate ID

- If a married couple files separately, both parents will need an FSA ID
- A married couple files together, only 1 Parent ID is needed
- Separated parent situations parent who provides the most financial support to the student will need an FSA ID

#### What do you need?

If you're a dependent student, you'll need this information for you and your parents.

- You and your parents will need an FSA (Federal Student Aid) ID to access the FAFSA® and sign the form electronically. The FSA ID must be obtained at studentaid.gov before you start the FAFSA®, and we recommend applying 3-5 days before you plan on starting the FAFSA®.
- Your Social Security number
- Your parents' Social Security numbers
- What do you no longer need? Student and parent tax documents. All of this information will be automatically accessed from the IRS through the FUTURE Act Direct Data Exchange (FADDX).

- S.C. Resident\*
- No Felony Convictions



- No second or subsequent alcohol/drug misdemeanors
- Not in default of any state or federal loans
- Enroll in a degree-seeking program at an eligible S.C. institution

## Hope Scholarshipup to\$2800SC Need Based Grantup to\$2500

Eligibility for the need based grant is based on the Free Application for Federal Aid (FAFSA). Fill out the FAFSA early, as funds are limited. See <u>www.che.sc.gov</u> for more information.





#### **Scholarships and Grants for SC Residents**

#### Lottery Tuition Assistance - (NOT based on need)

Up to \$110 per credit hour to be used toward the cost of tuition at eligible two-year technical institutions, USC two-year regional campuses, and Spartanburg Methodist College. Amount varies according to funding availability and number of applicants. Students already receiving the LIFE or HOPE scholarship are not eligible for this assistance.

#### SC Workforce & Industrial Needs Scholarship

Students receiving Lottery Tuition Assistance who are majoring in critical workforce areas may receive up to \$975 per semester, plus book allowance for critical workforce majors.

#### SC National Guard College Assistance Program \$4,500-\$9,000 per year toward tuition, not to exceed \$18,000 in total

## **Palmetto Fellows**



To be eligible, a senior must meet ONE of the two academic requirements below:



**1200 SAT\*/25 ACT\*, 3.5 GPA and rank in the top 6%** of the class at the end of the sophomore, junior, OR senior year.

 <u>1400 SAT\*/31 ACT\* and a 4.0 GPA</u> on the Uniform Grading Scale at the end of the junior year or senior year.

\*Super-scoring is allowed



### **Palmetto Fellows**



#### **Early Awards – April 15 deadline**

Qualifying SAT/ACT score must be earned by the March SAT/ACT Administration. Qualified students will be notified and Ms. Nation will complete the application for eligible students. Student is solely responsible for submitting designation sheet they will receive from CHE in the Spring.

#### Final Awards – June 30 deadline

Qualifying SAT/ACT score must be earned by the June SAT/ACT Administration. Qualified students will be notified in April. Student is solely responsible for submitting designation sheet they will receive from CHE in the Spring.

If June scores are to be used to qualify for PFS, the test scores must be reported directly to CHE from the test agency. SAT Code = 4313 ACT Code = 6326



#### **LIFE Scholarship**



**NO APPLICATION IS NECESSARY** – college of enrollment will determine eligibility status based on the graduate's <u>final high school transcript.</u>

To qualify for the LIFE scholarship as a first-year student at a FOUR-YEAR college or university, a student must meet <u>TWO</u> of the three requirements below:

- 3.0 SC UGP GPA on the final high school transcript
- 22 ACT or 1100 SAT (super-scoring allowed)
- Rank in top 30% of graduating class (no rounding allowed)

To qualify for the LIFE scholarship as a first-year student at TWO-YEAR college or technical institution, a student must meet the requirement below:

→ 3.0 SC UGP GPA on the final high school transcript.



#### **Keeping LIFE Scholarship**



#### → Basically earn 30 credit hours/year

 this does include AP or Dual Enrollment credits earned

#### → Life GPA - maintain a 3.0

 this also includes Dual Enrollment grades from high school



## **HOPE Scholarship**



**NO APPLICATION IS NECESSARY** – college of enrollment will determine eligibility status based on the graduate's **final high school transcript.** 

Eligible students attending a **FOUR-YEAR** public or private college receive up to \$2,800 during the first year of attendance only.

To be eligible, high school graduates must have a minimum 3.0 SC UGP GPA on the **final** transcript.

Recipients must not be a Life or Palmetto Fellows Scholarship recipient.



## S.C. Tuition Grants Program

- A need-based grant program awarding up to \$3,500 to students attending one of 21 eligible **private colleges in South Carolina**
- No application needed (FAFSA required)
- Must complete FAFSA between Oct 1 and June 30 and list the SC private school in the college choice section
- Must rank in upper 75% of graduating class OR score 900 SAT/19 ACT – AND have 2.7 SC UGP GPA
- South Carolina Tuition Grants cannot be used toward part-time enrollment, room and board charges, books, summer school enrollment, graduate school enrollment, or a second undergraduate degree. Students MUST enroll in the fall semester to receive the grant for an academic year.

## **NCAA Eligibility Center**



- ★ All athletes who intend to play Division 1 or Division 2 athletics must register online with the NCAA Eligibility Center at <u>https://web3.ncaa.org/ecwr3/</u>
- ★ Official high school transcripts are required. Students must submit a request for an official transcript through Parchment.
- ★ The registration fee is \$100. Fee waivers are available for students, so talk to your School Counselor to find out if you qualify.



#### **NCAA Eligibility**



#### **Full Qualifier for Division II:**

Complete 16 Core Courses - 10 of the 16 must be completed before the senior year and 7 of those 10 must be in English, math, or science.

Minimum Core GPA 2.2 (Minimum Core GPA 2.3 for Division I)

Division I - Academic Redshirt: (practice but not compete)

**Complete 16 Core Courses** 

Minimum Core GPA of 2.0

Official visits are any visit to a college campus paid for by the NCAA school you're visiting. Before a Division I or II official visit, you must:

Be on an IRL

Send Your High School Transcripts

#### **UNOFFICIAL VISITS**

Unofficial visits are any visit to a college campus paid by you or your family members.





## **NAIA Eligibility Center**



- ★ All athletes who intend to play NAIA athletics must register online with the NAIA Eligibility Center at <u>www.playnaia.org</u>
- ★ **Now** is the time for seniors to register
- ★ SAT/ACT scores may be submitted by the Testing Agencies (Code 9876). The Eligibility Center super scores the SAT and ACT. Official Transcripts are required.
- ★ Students must use Parchment to have transcript sent
- ★ The registration fee is \$80
