




Judges' Comment


"All three jurors expressed almost identical reaction to this building. Outside and inside it is quickly recognizable as a place for children. The tiresome design devices (cliches-fasions-pat answers) that are so evident in much current work were absent — period. The flow of spaces for the flow of children was clear and understandable with a glance at the plan and a look at the interior views."


The philosophy behind the educational program was: To provide a homelike environment for the learning process adaptable to varying size study groups; and to stress nature studies as a part of the curriculum.

The site selected on the present campus was a hillside sloping to a creek. The site satisfied the desire for a natural setting for nature studies and also placed the Lower School close to an existing kindergarten built at an earlier date. The flat area across the creek was selected for the site of an












Science Wing construction 1992








Chapel Construction 1956 from Back Bowl


