

I. CALL TO ORDER/FLAG SALUTE

The August 15, 2023 Public Meeting of the Edison Township Board of Education was called to order by Board President, Mrs. Shannon Peng, at 6:00 P.M. at th Education Center, 312 Pierson Avenue, Edison, NJ.

II. ROLL CALL

WHEREAS, the Edison Township Board of Education (“Board”) has submitted the proposed contract to the Middlesex County Executive Superintendent determining that the terms and conditions of “those provisions of the contract” between the Board and Edward Aldarelli, Ed.D. as Superintendent of Schools that are “subject to [his] review are in compliance with applicable laws and regulations” by letter dated August 14, 2023;

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Board hereby approves the contract for Edward Aldarelli, Ed.D. as Superintendent of Schools for the period commencing on August 16, 2023 through June 30, 2028.

## 2. Township Liaison Committee

The Township Liaison Committee met at 11:00 A.M. on June 25, 2023

In attendance were: Mayor Sam Joshi, Council Liaison Chair Ajay Patil, Councilwoman Joyce Ship-Freeman, Mayor's Chief of Staff Bob Diehl, Community Constituent Relations Coordinator Pat Coye, Edison Police Sgt. Lisa Cimmino, Superintendent of Schools Edward Aldarelli, Ed.D., Business Administrator/Board Secretary Jon Toth, Director of School Safety and Security Patrick Kissane, Board Members Mohin Patel, Jingwei "Jerry" Shi, and Virginia White. Via Zoom: Edison Fire Chief Andy Toth, Edison Deputy Chief of Police Bob Dudash, BOE member Biral Patel and Director of Communications and Policy for the BOE Heather Daniel.

### Discussion:

- Chief Toth touched on the Reunification Program. He also mentioned a Reunification Course Meeting follow-up. The Opportunities Video is still active.
- A lengthy discussion with Deputy Chief Dudash – many topics. The Junior Police Academy High School Program is completed. Participation was good, but a little less than last year. The Middle School Program is still in progress. Participation is good.
- Crossing Guards Privatization is a concern. They are attempting to select a vendor and had to go out for a rebid. Councilman Patil suggested that Edison residents be hired first.
- Biral Patel asked the following questions and requested that they be included in the minutes: (1) We hear from the community about crossing guards, what is the reason for privatizing? (2) What are the long-term solutions? Can the township develop a long-term solution and not privatize crossing guards and hire from Edison? (3) Asking to put a clause in the contract to hire Edison resident first for crossing guards.
- Mohin Patel asked if Senior Citizens can be asked to be crossing guards.
- Jerry Shi suggested considering double coverage if posts are in close proximity and time permits.
- Virginia White suggested to use the same idea used to recruit bus drivers. The public should be made aware of the need for crossing guards. It should be posted on the Board of Education webpage and outside the buildings wherever possible. It will also help the Police Department and most importantly the safety of the students.
- All of the above questions, concerns and suggestions were discussed with Deputy Chief Dudash.
- Sgt. Cimmino brought everyone up to date on the progress at Woodrow Wilson Middle School's traffic concerns on Gloria Avenue. Work is moving along. Signage on Gloria Avenue still needs to be done. In addition, Jackson Avenue is a concern. The residents are very worried about the truck traffic and traffic in general. Mrs. White and Mrs. Ship-Freeman attended a neighborhood meeting and understand the issues. Safety of the students in the morning and at dismissal is an issue. Mrs. Ship-Freeman suggested repainting the crosswalk lines and repainting the yellow curbs.
- Mr. Diehl stated the Mater Plan is on the Township Website. It is still under review and still open for suggestions.

- Mr. Shi asked Mayor Joshi about the status of Stelton School and the Mayor confirmed that the Board of Education will not get Stelton School. Mr. Shi asked this to go on record. With this information, the Board can plan accordingly.
- The Talmadge Road and Collidge Road property should be purchased by the end of the year. The application designated the property for recreation or education.
- Mr. Shi also asked about 401 Division Street. The Township does not object to working with the Board of Education regarding this property. Details are to be determined.

3. Transportation Committee

The Transportation Committee met on August 7, 2023

In attendance were: Joseph Romano, Jingwei “Jerry” Shi, Vishal Patel and Brian Rivera

FY2024 Transportation Routing:

- The Transportation Department implemented a new routing software called Transfinder. This software will allow for GPS tracking of district-owned buses for parents through the web application Stop Finder.
- District drivers will be selecting their route package on August 24<sup>th</sup> and have two days for dry runs on their routes.
- School bus assignments and bus stops will be available in the Genisis parent portal on August 28<sup>th</sup>.

Subscription Busing:

- The deadline for applying for subscription busing was June 30<sup>th</sup>.
- The Transportation Department received 3,223 applications for the 2023-2024 school year, of which 2,628 were eligible for subscription busing. All 2,628 applicants are being routed for next school year.

Buses:

- Currently, the District has 46 drivers for the bus fleet. The District would like to hire five to ten additional drivers for better transportation efficiency.
- All of the district-owned school buses are being fitted with Zonar fleet management solutions. Zonar will automate the pre-trip process and provides turn by turn directions for drivers.
