Learn how to use different types of nets and equipment to collect and study marine organisms and water quality of the Hudson River. We will maintain a classroom estuary tank that contains our catch! The Hudson River in our area is an estuary that contains both salt and fresh water. It is a location that is used by many marine and freshwater organisms as a nursery. Members will help to design a mural or booklet that will communicate the importance of the Hudson River in our daily lives and depict the animals that live there. We will be working with the Hudson River Museum to share what we find out! Field trips to the collection sites at Kingsland and Pearson Park are necessary for collecting.
