What Does It Mean To Be A Title I District?

 Being Title I Schoolwide means we receive federal funding to <u>supplement</u> the school's existing programs.





What Are These Funds Used For?

- Identifying students experiencing academic difficulties in Literacy & Math
- Providing assistance to help students meet the State's challenging standards.
- Funding supplemental staff, programs and materials.
- Parental Involvement
 - Meetings, Trainings & Activities
- Recruiting/Hiring/Retaining Highly Qualified Teachers
- Instructional Coaches, ELA IAs & Interventionists





The 1%

Any district with a Title I
 Allocation exceeding
 \$500K must set aside 1% of
 its Title I allocation for
 parental engagement
 activities.





What Is The Title I Plan?

 The District Title I School Improvement Plan addresses how the school will use Title I funds throughout the school system.

• Topics include:

- Additional assistance provided to struggling students
- Coordination and integration of federal funds and programs
- Parental Involvement Strategies, including the Parental Involvement Plan



Parent & Family Engagement Policy (2415.04)

- Addresses how each school will implement parent and family engagement including:
 - expectations for parents
 - o how parents can be involved in decision making
 - building the schools' and parents' capacity for strong parental involvement to improve student academic achievement
 - how parental involvement funds are being used
 - what information and training will be provided to parents.




What is the Annual School Plan (ASP)?

- The ASP includes:
 - A Needs Assessment and Summary of the data
 - Goals and Strategies to address the academic needs of students
 - Professional Development needs
 - Coordination of Resources/Comprehensive Budget
 - The School's Parental Involvement Plan



What Is The School-Parent Compact?

 The compact is a commitment between the school, the parent, and the student to share in the responsibility for improved academic achievement.





Our Teachers

- As parents of students attending a Title I Schoolwide District, you have the right to request the qualifications of your child's teachers.
- Currently, 100% of our teachers meet the Highly Qualified requirements.
 - 55% of our teachers have Advanced Degrees.
 - 58% of our teachers have Multiple Certifications.
